This Cause standing ready for hearing and being submitted without argument, the proceedings were read and considered. >

It is thereupon this 4th day of June in the year Eighteen hundred and sixty four, by me Madison Nelson Judge of the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting as a Court of Equity and by the authority of this Court, adjudged, ordered and decreed, that the land and premises in this Cause mentioned and described be sold. >

That Leonidas Willson he and he is hereby appointed Trustee to make such sale, and the course and manner of his proceedings shall be as follows: He shall first file in the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court for Frederick County a bond to the State of Maryland, executed by himself with a surety or sureties to be approved by the Clerk of said County, in the penalty of five hundred dollars, conditioned for the faithful performance of the trust reposed in him by this decree or which may be reposed in him by any future decree
