Be it remembered that heretofore to wit on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of December 1864 came the said Simon C. Simmons and Alice Robertson in Court here sitting by Grayson Eichelberger Solicitor and filed in Court here the following Petition &c.

In the Hon. Madison Nelson Judge of the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting as a Court of Equity.

The petition of Simon C. Simmons, Guardian and next friend of Alexander Robertson, Grace J. Robertson and Charles H. W. Robertson and Alice Robertson, respectfully shows unto your Honor that Jacob Meyers in his lifetime was seized and possessed of a lot of ground lying upon Calvert Street in the City of Baltimore which was leased to the said Jacob Meyers for the term of ninety nine years renewable forever that the said Jacob Meyers upon the 15<sup>th</sup> day of February 1849, by his deed of trust duly made and executed, conveyed all his right and title in said lot of ground together with all buildings and improvements thereon, unto one Alexander J. Miller in trust, that the said Jacob Meyers be permitted to use, occupy and enjoy the same during the term of his natural life and immediately after the decease of the said Jacob Meyers then in trust that Emilee A. Meyers, the daughter of the said Jacob Meyers during the term of her natural life, be permitted and suffered to have, hold, use, possess and enjoy the said ground and premises and the rents, issues and profits thereof to receive take and apply to her own use and benefit without being in any manner subject to the control, power or disposal of any future husband she might have or
