Know ye, that the last will and testament of Peter Storm dec'd, hath in due form of Law, been exhibited, proved and recorded in the Office of Register of Wills for Frederick County, a copy of which is to these presents annexed, and administration of all the goods, chattels and credits of the deceased, is hereby granted and committed unto Mary Storm Executrix by the said will appointed. - Witness Henry Kalin Esq. Exhibit No. 2.

In the name of God Amen - I Peter Storm of Frederick Town (Frederick County) Maryland expecting to leave this world in a short time, and being as yet of a sound disposing mind, wishing to arrange my worldly affairs, the better to meet my God, do hereby declare and publish this paper as my last will and testament. -

First - It is my desire that my funeral expenses be discharged by my hereinafter named Executrix as soon as practicable out of any monies now in hand, or that can be produced out of any property (personal) that is now in my possession. -

Secondly - It is my desire that my Executrix collect all debts due me without delay, and out of these monies discharge all accounts against me, and any balance remaining in my favor. - I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Storm, for her use and the support of her family. -

Thirdly - It is my desire that my Executrix dispose of my lot in Lewisstown to the best advantage, and the proceeds I give and bequeath to my aforesaid wife Mary Storm, for her, and the family's use. -

Fourthly - All my personal estate, I give and bequeath unto my aforesaid wife Mary Storm, with liberty to dispose of any part thereof, which she and the family may not have use for. - Fifthly - The house I now reside in, and all the ground attached to it, and now held by me, I give unto my aforesaid wife Mary Storm, to be held and occupied by her, as long as she remains my widow, and that she have all the profits and advantages thereof during her natural life, provided she remains in widowhood, - but should she enter into the state of matrimony after my decease, then it is my will and desire, that the said real property, and all the profits arising from it, be the property of my three children, Peter Leonard Storm, Marian Elizabeth Storm and Lydia Rebecca Storm,

should my aforesaid wife Mary Storm, enter into matrimony again, or whenever she shall leave this world, then I desire my children aforesaid, to divide said property equally among each other and in such manner as Equity and peace among them will dictate. Lastly - I do hereby appoint and declare my beloved wife, Mary Storm, sole Executrix of this my last will and testament. - In Testimony whereof I do hereby subscribe my hand and affix my seal, this 27th day of April in the year of our Lord 1821. -
