Geo. W. Cromwell, Oliver D. Cromwell, George and W. E. Cromwell others

The object of this suit is to have a decree for the sale of a house and lot of ground in Frederick town for the purpose of distribution among the devisees of Peter Storm dec'd.

The bill states that a certain Peter Storm in his lifetime made and executed his last will and testament in due form of law to give real estate, and soon after died without in any manner having revoked the same. That said last will and testament was duly admitted to probate by the Orphan's Court of said County, and that said testator among other things, devised a certain house and lot in Frederick City to his wife Mary Storm to hold during her natural life or widowhood, and at her death the same to go to his three children Peter Leonard Storm, Marian Storm and Lydia N. Storm to be amongst them equally divided.

Answer of Geo. W. Cromwell

The bill further states that said Mary Storm died in the month of November in the year Eighteen hundred and sixty two. - that said Marian Storm was married to one Geo. W. Cromwell and died leaving her said husband surviving her and the following named children as her only heirs at law, viz; Oliver D. Cromwell, George and W. E. Cromwell, Leonard S. Cromwell who has since been married to Maria Ann, Charles C. Cromwell; - that said Lydia N. Storm was married to one Jacob Dargeman and together with her said husband has since died leaving as her only child and heir at law Abner Eugene Dargeman, who has intermarried with one Charles W. Eades; that all of said parties are living in Frederick County except Charles W. Cromwell who resides in Illinois and is beyond the limits of the State of Maryland - and that said house and lot cannot be divided among said parties and that the interest of all will be promoted by the sale of said real estate.

Answer of Lewis Stein Volkers

It is therefore this ninth day of May 1864. ordered that the Complainant by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County, once in each of four successive weeks before the 15th day of June 1864 give notice to said absent defendant of the object and substance of this bill; and warn him to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor on or before the 19th day of September next to answer the premises and show cause if any he has, why a decree ought not to pass as prayed.
