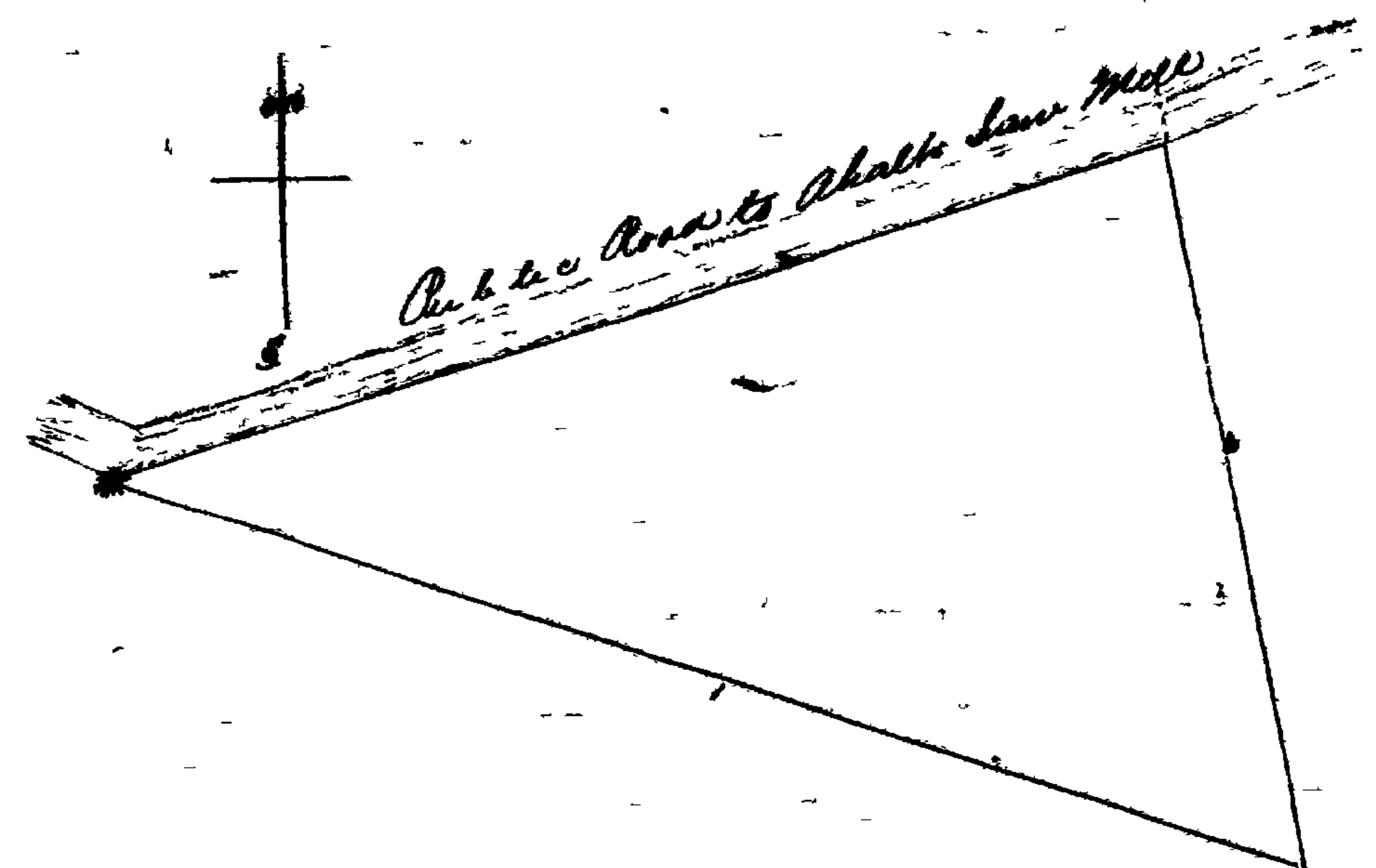


- 10th - North 24 1/2" East 25 ft to a stone formerly planted, - 11th North 64 1/2" East 28 feet to a stake now planted, - 12th South 7 6/7" East 10 ft to a stake now planted, 13 - North 23 1/2", East 52 1/2 ft to a stone formerly planted at the end of 120 ft on the 7th and last line of a tract of land called 'Uncle's left'; and with it reversed 12th North 43 1/2" West 15 feet to a stone formerly planted on the 32^d line of a tract of land called 'William's farm' and with said 32^d line reversed, 15th North 42 1/2" West 41 ft to a stone formerly planted, 16th North 75 1/2" West 11 1/10 ft to the first mentioned place of beginning containing (including one quarter of an acre heretofore granted the Dunbar Society for a burying ground and that portion south of the road leading to Mr. Levi Mill, sold to Mr. Hovey, sixty two acres, one rood and one and a half square perches of land, -

Part of 'David's Purchase': - Beginning for the same at the end of 37 1/100 ft on the 29th and last line of the whole tract David's Purchase, and running thence with said line crossing the same for variation South 72 1/4" East 22 7/100 ft to a large stone marker B, it being the beginning of said tract 'David's Purchase' thence with the first line of said tract, crossing as aforesaid North 10 1/4" West 12 1/100 ft to the South margin of the road leading to Shalt's Saw Mill and thence with said road South 73 1/4" West 20 1/100 ft to the beginning containing Oct. 3^d 1862

I hereby certify that I have carefully surveyed John Ansel's farm comprising a part of 'Hawkins' Purchase'; a part of 'The Lost Pen and Ink'; and a part of 'Soldier's Manor' and have included the same in one general outline, - beginning for the same at a stone formerly planted and standing at the end of the 15th or North 83" West 73 1/2 perches line of that part of the 'Parish of Greenwood' which was conveyed to Thomas S. Lee by William Lee the 31st May 1843 for 100 acres and running thence with the out-fencing of 4 1/2 acres part of 'Soldier's Manor' and part of 'The Lost Pen and Ink'; which was conveyed to John Ansel by Mrs. Gouveneur North 30 1/4" West 20 1/2" North 74 1/4" West 9 1/100 perches to the end of a stone fence at the corner of Mrs. Gouveneur's land thence with the out-fencing of her land South 4 1/2" West 3 1/100 perches South 23 1/4" West 2 1/100 ft to a stone formerly planted South 2" West 1 1/100 perches to the end of the 2^d line of 'Hawkins' Purchase'; and with the 3^d line thence South 2 1/2" West 20 ft then still by and with the out-fencing of Mrs. Gouveneur's land South 13 1/2" West 8 1/100 ft South 38 1/2" West 27 1/100 ft South 20 1/2" West 2 ft South 7" West 17 1/100 ft South 7 1/2" East 16 1/100 perches South 3 1/2" East 11 perches South 13 1/2" East 25 1/100, South 10 1/4" East 43 1/100 ft to a point in an outline of Thomas S.
