Cady and William Dray were attached to the note of which Exhibit 'D' is a copy - that Christian Gutzendanner was the principal in said note and the other securities - that Christian Gutzendanner himself brought said note to the Central Bank for discount and had it discounted that to the best of deponent's knowledge the signature 'Christian Gutzendanner' attached to the said note is in the proper handwriting of the said Christian Gutzendanner, -

To the special interrogatories said P. L. Storm deposes and says, -

To the first - that he is Cashier of the Central Bank, of Frederick - that on the 27th day of July 1863 Margaret Gutzendanner, widow of Christian Gutzendanner dec'd - paid on said note, (of which Exhibit 'D' is a copy) the sum of one hundred and thirteen dollars and eleven cents to the Central Bank of Frederick, -

To the 2nd that there is due to the Central Bank of Frederick, on said note, the sum of three hundred and thirty seven dollars with interest from the eighteenth day of July 1863, -

There being no other witnesses present to be examined and the Complainants requiring no further time for the production of their evidences, and the Complainants having filed with the Commissioner as Evidence Exhibits 'A', 'B' and 'D'; which are herewith returned, the Commissioner closed the said Commission and herewith returns the same under his hand and seal this sixth day of February 1865, -

This cause standing ready for hearing and being submitted without argument, the proceedings were read and considered: -

It is therefore on this 6th day of February in the year Eighteen hundred and sixty five, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, advised, ordered and decreed, that the real estate of Christian Gutzendanner, dec'd in the proceedings mentioned be sold or so much thereof as may be necessary for the payment of his debts, that Joseph W. L. Cady of Frederick County, Maryland, be and he is hereby appointed Trustee, to make sale, and that the course and manner of his proceedings shall be as follows: He shall first file with the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, a bond to the State of Maryland executed by himself, with a surety or sureties to be approved by the Circuit Court for Frederick County or the Clerk thereof in the penalty of twenty five hundred dollars, conditioned for the faithful performance of the trust reposed in him by this decree or which may be reposed in him by any future order or decree in the premises: He shall then proceed to make sale of the said real estate, having first given three weeks previous notice, inserted in some newspaper printed in Frederick County, and such other notice, as he may think proper of the time, place, manner and terms of sale; which terms shall be as follows: one half cash and the balance in twelve months, the whole to bear interest from the day of sale and the payment thereof to be secured by the bonds of the purchaser, with a surety or sureties to be approved by the Trustee, and as soon as may be convenient after any such sale or sales, the said Trustee shall return to this Court -
