In the 5th That William, son of Perry Rice dec'd died about ten years since - that he left children in the state of Ohio, the number, ages and names are unknown to this deponent. -

In the 6th That Thomas, son of Perry Rice dec'd, died about the year A. D. 1836 - that he left three children, namely Perry A. Rice dec'd and leaving several children whose names and ages are unknown to this deponent; Sarah A Rice; and Mary A Shaffer, since dec'd, leaving son Edward Shaffer, an infant under the age of twenty one years. -

In the 7th That Martha, daughter of Perry Rice, died sixteen or seventeen years ago, leaving the following children, namely, Abraham P. Willard, George Willard, Catherine E. Wren, Martha Wren, Harriet Wren, Mary J. Spoke, Luther Wren, Loretta Cheford, all adults and all reside in Frederick County, Maryland, except Abraham J. Willard, who resides in the state of Missouri, -

In the 8th That George B. Rice son of Perry Rice dec'd died about five years ago, leaving thirteen children, namely, Edward J. Mary J. E. Rice, Catherine A. V. married to Henry W. Stagle, Martha E. D. Rice, George B. L. Rice, James S. H. Rice, adults, living in Frederick County, Maryland; Milton G. Rice, Martin J. B. Rice, Perry H. Rice, Lewis F. B. Rice, America W. C. Rice, Ohio W. Rice and Hiram J. Rice, who are infants under twenty one years of age and live in Frederick County, Maryland. -

In the 9th That he knows the real estate devised by Perry Rice to his widow during her life, that it is the same as is described in Exhibits A, B, C, & D, now here shown him. -

In the 10th That said real estate is not susceptible of an advantageous division among the parties interested. -

In the 11th That it would be to the advantage of all the parties interested that said real estate should be sold and the proceeds of such sales be distributed amongst the parties entitled thereto. Luther W. Rice, a witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the Complainants, being duly sworn and Examined to interrogatories filed with the Commissioners and herewith returned deposes and says. -

In the 12th That he is acquainted with all of the parties to this suit - that they are all adults above the age of twenty one years, except Milton G. Rice, Martin J. B. Rice, Perry H. Rice, Lewis F. B. Rice, America W. C. Rice, Ohio W. Rice, Hiram J. Rice and Edward Shaffer, who are infants under twenty one years of age. -

In the 13th That Martha Rice, widow of Perry Rice is dead - that she died during the month of April Eighteen hundred and sixty four. -

In the 14th That Perry Rice dec'd had thirteen children, namely Rebecca, married to Merim J. Haman who resides in the state of Kentucky; Anne, married to Samuel Cecil, who resides in Frederick County Maryland; Elizabeth, married to Elisha Rhodes, sometime dec'd who resides in Frederick County Maryland; Perry G. Rice, who resides in Frederick County, Maryland; Penjamin Rice who resides in the state of Indiana; Mary, married to Perry G. Thomas, who resides in Frederick County, Maryland; James Rice dec'd; William Rice dec'd; Thomas Rice dec'd; Martha, dec'd who was married to Isaac Wren, of Frederick County, Maryland; George B. Rice and John C. Rice dec'd who resides in the state of Iowa -

In the 15th That James Rice died about forty years ago, leaving three children, namely, Edward J. Rice, James W. Rice and Reuben C. Rice all adults, above the age of twenty one years. -

In the 16th That William Rice, son of Perry Rice dec'd died about ten years since, that he left the children in the state of Ohio, the number, names and ages of whom are unknown to this
