3<sup>rd</sup> Did said Cornelius Parrick leave a widow now living?

4<sup>th</sup> Do you or do you not know the lands of which said Cornelius Parrick died, seized and possessed? If yes, look at the Exhibits now shown you, did he not die seized of the property described in said Exhibits? State fully all your knowledge therein?

5<sup>th</sup> Did or did not the said Cornelius Parrick die intestate? If so, state to whom did his property descend? Give the names and ages of all of his heirs at law, to the best of your knowledge, and their present places of residence. Do they live within or beyond the limits of the State of Maryland?

6<sup>th</sup> State to the best of your knowledge the value and quality of said lands? State fully all your knowledge.

7<sup>th</sup> Would said land admit of division among all of said Cornelius Parrick's children and heirs at law without injury and loss? And would it not be to the advantage of all the parties concerned, infants as well as adults, that said real Estate should be sold?
