The Bill of Complaint of John Innes who does well for himself as all other Creditors of Jacob Smith late of said County dec. who will come in and contribute to the expenses of this suit, humbly shows that a certain Jacob Smith late of Frederick County dec. purchased in his lifetime from Jacob J. Forrest of Frederick County, certain tracts and parcels of land, containing in all about 12 or 13 acres more or less situate in Frederick County and obtained and took possession of the said lands in his said Smith's lifetime and gave and passed to the said Forrest his six single bills for the payment of fifty dollars each with interest from the first day of April 1851 until they be respectively paid to wit: at the period of one year from said first day of April 1851, fifty dollars with interest at the period of two years from first day of April 1851, also for fifty dollars current money with interest at the period of three years with interest from the first April 1851, also for fifty dollars at the period of four years with interest from the first day of April 1851, for fifty dollars current money at the period of five years with interest from the first day of April 1851, for fifty dollars current money and at the period of six years with interest from said first day of April 1851, for fifty dollars current money, that all and each of the said single bills were for a valuable consideration assigned by said Jacob J. Forrest on the 9th day
