The Bill of Complaint of Henry Co. Donnell of Frederick County and State of Maryland respectfully shows to your Honor - that a certain Albert Howe of the County and State aforesaid being indebted to your Complainant by his single bill dated on the third day of April Eighteen hundred and sixty in the sum of two hundred and twenty five dollars payable twelve months with interest from date, - and also being security on three single bills executed by said Albert Howe & your Complainant to certain Joseph Shank, all of said single bills being dated on the second day of April Eighteen hundred and sixty - payable respectively on the first day of April Eighteen hundred and sixty one - on the first day of April Eighteen hundred and sixty two - on the first day of April Eighteen hundred and sixty three each for the sum of two hundred dollars with interest from date - the whole of said single bills amounting in the aggregate to the sum of six hundred dollars, - and for the purpose of securing the payment of the said single bill dated April 3^d 1860 payable to your Complainant in the sum of two hundred and twenty five dollars together with the interest that may be due thereon - and to secure and save harmless your Complainant as endorser or security; on the three single bills aforesaid payable to Joseph Shank as aforesaid and any interest that may be due thereon the said Albert Howe & and Mary Ann Howe his wife, did
