The object of the Complainant's bill of Complaint in this case is to obtain a decree for the sale of certain real Estate of which Frederick Derr died seized and possessed, for the purpose of paying the debt of said deceased, his personal estate not being sufficient therefor.

The bill, which is filed as well for the Complainant as for all other Creditors of said Frederick Derr who shall come in and contribute to the Expenses of this suit, states that the said Frederick Derr by his promissory note dated the 30th day of July in the year Eighteen Hundred and sixty two, promised to pay sixty days after date to Complainant's Cashier or order, the sum of one Hundred dollars, and that said Frederick Derr died intestate sometime in the month of December in the year Eighteen Hundred and sixty three, without having paid said note or any part of the same. The bill further states that Frederick Derr was seized and possessed at the time of his death of a tract of land containing about seven acres; that letters of administration on the personal Estate of said deceased, were granted by the Orphans Court of Frederick County to Daniel Derr; that said personal Estate is insolvent and insufficient to pay the debts of said intestate and that the Creditors of said intestate are entitled to have said real Estate sold for the payment of his debt.

Commission

The bill still further states that Frederick Derr died leaving Elyse Ann Derr as his widow, and John Wesley Derr, David Frank Derr, Albert Jacob, Harriet A. W., Hannah Rebecca and Annanda Sophia Derr as his children and only heirs, at law all of whom are infants, and that the said John Wesley Derr is a non resident and beyond the limits of the state of Maryland.

It is therefore this 11th day of May 1864 ordered that the Complainant, by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper printed in Frederick County, once in each of four successive weeks before the 15th day of June 1864, give notice to said absent defendant of the object and substance of this bill and summon him to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor on or before the 15th day of September next to answer the premises and show cause, if any he have why a decree should not pass as prayed.
