This Indenture made this third day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty four between John H. Worthington of Frederick County in the State of Maryland of the one part, and Nicholas Worthington of John of Montgomery County and State aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth that the said John H. Worthington as well for and in Consideration of the natural regard and affection which the said John H. Worthington hath and beareth unto the said Nicholas Worthington of his, as also for the support of him the said Nicholas Worthington of his, hath given, granted, aliened, conveyed and confirmed and by these presents doth give, grant alien, convey and confirm unto the said Nicholas Worthington of his, his heirs and assigns, all those parts of three several tracts of lands lying on the waters of Seneca Creek in Montgomery County aforesaid, that was willed to the said John H. Worthington by his father James Worthington of John late of Montgomery County dec^d - viz: part of a tract called Watkins Range, part of the Addition to Watkins Range, and part of Queens Runway, containing in the aggregate two hundred acres of land more or less, together with all and singular the buildings and every other improvements known as part or parcel of, or belonging to the same, and every part and parcel thereof with the appurtenances therunto belonging.

To have and to hold the said piece or parts of tracts of land and premises hereby granted and confirmed with the appurtenances unto the said Nicholas Worthington of his his heirs and assigns forever.
