This indenture, made this 27th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred
and fifty six, between Samuel D. Walker and Rebecca S. Walker his wife, in the County of Frederick
and State of Maryland of the first part, and Abraham Suchwaller and John M. Wright Flour
Merchants in the City of Baltimore and State of Maryland of the second part, Witnesseth
that the said party of the first part, in consideration of the sum of fifteen hundred dollars law-
ful money of the United States, to them in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
have granted, bargained, sold, aliened, remised, released, conveyed and confirmed, and by these
presents do grant, bargain, sell, alien, remise, release, convey and confirm unto the said party
of the second part, and to their heirs and assigns forever, all that parcel of land situate, lying
and being in Frederick County aforesaid, being parts of Lots No 11 and 12 of a tract of land called
"The Resurvey on Mackay Luck"; containing 47 acres and 35 perches of land and being the same
parcel of land heretofore conveyed to Rebecca S. Walker, wife of S. D. Walker by Wm. Ross Justice
of Arch. Jones, and also another parcel of land heretofore conveyed to Rebecca S. Walker, wife of
S. D. Walker by Wm. Ross, and recorded in Liber C. D. No 1 folio 179 & 180, One of the Land Records of
Frederick County, reference thereto here will fully appear; Together with all and singular the
