And your orator represents that said real estate is not susceptible of an advantageous division amongst the parties interested and that it would be to the benefit and advantage of all parties concerned that the same should be sold and the proceeds arising from such sale be distributed amongst the parties entitled thereto in proportion to their respective interests.

It is the end therefore that the said real estate may be sold under a decree of your Honorable Court and the proceeds thereof distributed amongst the said parties in proportion to their respective interests and that your orator may have such other and further relief as the nature of his case may require.

May it please your Honor to grant unto your Orator an order of publication, giving notice to the said Hannah C. Himes, who is a non-resident, as before stated, of the substance and object of this Bill and warning her to appear in this Court, in person or by solicitor, on or before a certain day, to answer the premises and shew cause, if any she has why a decree ought not to pass as prayed and also the writ of Subpoena against the said William Himes, Samuel C. Himes, Elizabeth A. Himes, Eliza A. Himes and Martha C. Himes, commanding them to appear in this Court at some certain day to be therein named, to answer the premises and obey by and perform such decree as may be passed therein.

This Deed made this 24th day of March in the year Eighteen hundred and sixty two by Hannah Stotttemper widow of Nelson Stotttemper late of Frederick County in the State of Maryland dec^d and George W. Stotttemper and Rebecca his wife, James C. Stotttemper and Mary Jane his wife, Nelson S. Stotttemper and Sarah A. C. his wife, Daniel Stotttemper and Catharine his wife, William H. Stotttemper and Amanda his wife, William Stotttemper and Catharine his wife Christian Harman and Mary S. his wife, George Harman and Sabelian his wife, Joshua Lane and Catharine his wife, Moses S. Hurley and Mahala his wife, and Benjamin Shuff and Sarah his wife, heirs at law of the aforesaid Nelson Stotttemper dec^d. Witnesseth that in consideration of seven hundred dollars the Hannah Stotttemper widow as aforesaid and the aforesaid heirs at law as above named do grant and sell unto Daniel Stotttemper of the County and State aforesaid, all their interest in that lot or parcel of land situated in the County and State aforesaid, being part of a tract of land called 'The Reserve on Almost Knight' granted Peter Rudy on or about the first day of November in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty four, beginning for the same at the end of 2 1/4 perches on the seventh line of the whole tract of land called 'The Reserve on Almost Knight' and running thence -

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
