Be it remembered that heretofore to wit on the 30th day of January 1865, came the said Jacob Ludy in Court here sitting by Grayson Eichelberger Solicitor and filed in Court the following Bill and Exhibits.

Bill

In the Honorable Madison Nelson Judge of the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting as a Court of Equity

The Bill of Complaint of Jacob Ludy of said County respectfully sheweth unto your Honor that a certain John Warefels was in his lifetime indebted to your Orator in the sum of thirty three dollars and forty cents by his single bill bearing date the 12th day of April 1858 and payable six months after date with interest from date that the said John Warefels paid to your Orator the sum of twenty five dollars on the 16th day of May 1859, and five dollars in March 1862, which are credited on said single bill, as will fully appear by said single bill filed herewith as Exhibit No 1, which with all other Exhibits your Orator prays may be taken as part of this Bill of Complaint as if here inserted in words and figures, that the said John Warefels died intestate, about the first day of January 1864 leaving the balance of the money specified in said single bill unpaid and due and owing to your Orator that said John Warefels died seized and possessed of several parcels or parts of tracts of land called 'Susan Eves' and 'The Three Brothers' containing ninety four acres and seventeen square perches of land, which are partly more fully described in the deeds for the same from Jacob Brown and wife, Samuel Wolf and wife, and Christian Knechtman and wife, true and certified copies whereof are filed herewith as Exhibits Nos 2, 3 and 4, that John Warefels being indebted to one David Myers conveyed to said David Myers the parcels of land specified and described in Exhibits No 2 and 3 by way of mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of seven hundred dollars due and owing by him to said David Myers as will appear by said mortgage, a true and certified copy whereof is filed herewith as Exhibit No 5 that letters of administration were by the Orphan's Court of said County granted to Daniel Warefels on the personal estate of said John Warefels dec: as
