Warensfel elects to have her dower interest in the real estate of her said husband laid off and assigned to her by commissioners appointed by your Honor for that purpose -

In tender consideration whereof and for that your Orator is reminded by the strict rules of the common law and relieves only in a Court of Equity, where matters of this nature are properly cognizable; In the end therefore that the said Margaret J. Warensfel, John C. Warensfel, Suttan No. Warensfel, Charles M. Warensfel, Gould J. Warensfel, Mary J. Warensfel, Effie G. Warensfel, Daniel Warensfel, and Daniel Myers may answer all the charges and matters aforesaid and that said real estate may be sold by a trustee to be appointed by your Honor and the proceeds applied under the direction of the Court according to rights of the respective parties and that your Orator may have all such other and further relief as the nature of the case may require and to your Honor shall seem meet - May it please your Honor to grant unto your Orator the writ of Maryland's writ of subpoena to be directed to the said Margaret A. Warensfel, John C. Warensfel, Suttan No. Warensfel, Charles M. Warensfel, Gould J. Warensfel, Mary J. Warensfel, Effie G. Warensfel and Daniel Warensfel of Frederick County and Daniel Myers of Washington County thereby commanding them to be and appear before your Honor in your Honorable Court on a day therein to be named in person or by solicitor to answer all and singular the premises and to stand to, abide and perform such order and decree therein as to your Honor shall seem meet - And as in duty bound your Orator will ever pray
