The separate answer of Samuel Eichelberger to the bill of complaint of Martha A. Eichelberger and as next friend of George Milton Eichelberger infant against him and others in the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting in Equity. Exhibited.

This Respondent for answer to said bill of complaint admits to be true the several matters and things in said bill alleged so far as he is concerned, and he admits that Exhibit B is a true copy of the mortgage in said bill mentioned, and also he brings herewithin about the promissory notes of the said Samuel E. Eichelberger, mentioned in said bill which were given to this respondent as set forth in said bill of complaint, marked defendants Exhibits No 1 and 2, and he states that the whole amount due to him is the balance after credits thereon of the note falling due first April 1868, and the note falling due first April 1870, with interest from first April 1863, the balance of said debt having been paid, and he consents that a decree may pass as prayed by said bill of complaint so far forth as his rights and interests are concerned.

The State of Maryland. To Leonard Ticking Esq of Frederick County, Circuit Judge, whereas Martha A. Eichelberger Guardian of George Milton Eichelberger infant has lately exhibited her bill of complaint before me in the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, against George Milton Eichelberger and others and whereas I have by my writ, lately commanded the said defendants to appear before me in said Court as Court of Equity, at a certain day now past, to answer the said bill of complaint but for as much as the said George Milton Eichelberger is an infant under age, and cannot answer the said bill of complaint nor defend this suit, without having a guardian assigned in that behalf - know ye, therefore, that I have given unto you full power and authority in pursuance of the special order in said Court, to assign & appoint a guardian for the aforesaid infant, and to take the answer of the said infant, by such guardian to the said bill of complaint, and therefore I command you, that at such certain day and place as you shall think fit, you assign and appoint a guardian for the aforesaid infant, and take the answer of the said infant, by such guardian to the said bill of complaint on such guardian's corporal oath upon the Holy Evangelists, to be administered by you, the said answer being distinctly and plainly wrote, and when you shall have taken the said answer, you are to send the same closed up under your seal, together with your certificate of your having assigned and appointed such guardian as aforesaid, and this writ, note me in said Court.
