

therefore is insufficient to keep the property in good order and repair after deducting the widow's dower and the maintenance of the said infant Jno. M. Eichelberger - the said land contains one hundred and forty four acres and is worth about twenty eight hundred or three thousand dollars. - To the 5th - That the said infant has no means of support other than the rents or profits arising from said land and that the rent of the said land, after deducting the widow's dower will not be sufficient for the maintenance and education of said infant. - To the 6th - That he knows nothing further. -

John Hahn, a witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the complainant, being duly sworn and examined to interrogatories filed with the commission by the complainant and herewith returned, deposes and says, -

To the first - That he knew Samuel C. Eichelberger, late of Frederick County, Maryland, that he is dead, that he died during the month of March, Eighteen hundred and fifty three.

To the 2nd, That the said Samuel C. Eichelberger left a widow named Margaret A. aged about twenty four years and one child George W. Eichelberger, an infant under the age of twenty one years. - To the 3rd - That the said Samuel C. Eichelberger left a last will and testament and that "Exhibit A" now shown to deponent is a copy of said last will and testament.

To the 4th, That John Hahn, the Executor named in the said will has fully administered the personal estate and has also sold the real estate therein directed to be sold and has applied the proceeds in a due course of administration to the payment of the debts of the testator. - To the 5th, That he is not sufficiently acquainted with the handwriting of the testator Samuel C. Eichelberger to say if the signatures attached to Dependant Exhibits No. 1 and 2, are the proper handwriting of the said Samuel C. Eichelberger. -

To the 6th, That there are no means, real or personal, from which the balances due on said Exhibits "Dependants Exhibits No. 1 and 2" can be paid, except by a sale of the real estate devised by said last will to the infant child of the said Samuel C. Eichelberger. - To the 7th, That it will be for the benefit and advantage of the said infant child that the land devised to him by the said will be sold and the proceeds be invested for his benefit - That the land is depreciating in value and that the rent of the same will not admit of its being kept in proper order and repair - that it consists of one hundred and forty four acres, and is worth about twenty five hundred dollars. - To the 8th - That the said infant child has no other means of support except the proceeds of the sale of said land and that the rents of said land would be inadequate to the maintenance and education of the said infant child. - To the 9th - That he knows nothing further. -

John Miller, a witness of lawful age produced by the complainant, being duly sworn and examined to interrogatories filed with the commission by the complainant and herewith returned deposes and says, -

To the first - That he was acquainted with Samuel C. Eichelberger, late of Frederick County Md, that he is dead, that he died upwards of two years ago - To the 2nd, That the said Samuel C. Eichelberger left a widow and one child - that the widow's name is Margaret C. Eichelberger, that she is about twenty five years of age, that the child's name is Jno. Milton Eichelberger, that he is an infant under the age of twenty one years. - To the 3rd - That he knows nothing. -

To the 4th, That he knows nothing. - To the 5th, That he knows nothing. - To the 6th - That he knows nothing. - To the 7th - That it will be to the advantage and benefit of the infant child that the land devised to him by the last will of Samuel C. Eichelberger be sold and the proceeds invested for his benefit - that the said land is in wretched order and is getting worse every day and that the rent that could be received from said land would be insufficient for the maintenance and support of the said infant child, that the land contains about one hundred and forty four acres and is worth about twenty eight hundred dollars. - To the 8th -
