

That he does not know what means the said infant child possesses but is of the opinion that the rent of the land, after deducting the widow's dower, would be insufficient for the maintenance and education of the said infant child. To the 9th - That he knows nothing further. There being no other witnesses present to be examined and the complainant requiring further time for the production of her evidence, the Commissioner further adjourned the said Commission to the twenty second day of August, Eighteen hundred and sixty five, at which time and at the place aforesaid, the Commissioner proceeded to take the following depositions, to-wit:

Daniel Lamb of S. a witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the complainant, being duly sworn and examined to interrogatories filed with the Commissioner by the complainant and herewith returned, deposes and says:

To the 1st, That he knew Saml C. Eichelberger late of Frederick County, that he is dead - that he died about three years since. To the 2nd - That said Samuel C. Eichelberger left a widow named Margaret A. aged about twenty five years, and a child Geo. W. an infant under the age of twenty one years. To the 3rd - That he knows nothing. To the 4th - That he knows nothing. To the 5th - That he knows nothing. To the 6th - That he knows nothing. To the 7th - That it would be to the advantage of the infant child to see the land devised to him by the will of Saml C. Eichelberger and to invest the proceeds thereof for the benefit of said infant child - for the reason that it would be impracticable to rent the land for sufficient to maintain the infant child and to keep the land in order - that the land is daily falling in value - the land contains about one hundred and fifty four acres and is worth about twenty eight hundred dollars or about twenty dollars per acre. To the 8th - That the rent after deducting the widow's dower, will be insufficient for the support and education of the said infant child. To the 9th - That he knows nothing further.

There being no other witnesses present to be examined and the complainant requiring no further time for the production of her evidence the Commissioner closed the said Commission and herewith returns the same under his hand and seal on this 22<sup>d</sup> day of August, Eighteen hundred and sixty five.
