

Your Complainant further states that the said John Legore having indebted to Abraham Myers in the sum of seven hundred dollars to secure the payment of the same at the time stipulated for the payment thereof and on the conditions therein stated, did by deed of mortgage convey the said lands described in Exhibit No 1, to Abraham Myers as will be seen by a copy of the said mortgage herewith Exhibited marked Exhibit No 2.

Your Complainant further states that the said John Legore by his single bill dated on the 24th day of February Eighteen hundred and sixty four, was indebted to your Complainant in the sum of forty nine dollars and fifty cents, payable one day after date and by his other single bill dated 17th day of April Eighteen hundred and sixty four, payable one day after date was indebted to your Complainant in the sum of thirty one dollars and seventy five cents, and by open account was indebted to your Complainant in the sum of eleven dollars, all of which matters will appear by reference to Exhibit No 3, Exhibit No 4 and Exhibit No 5.

Your Complainant further charges that the said several sums of money are still due and unpaid, not having been paid by the said John Legore in his lifetime or by his administration since his death. Your Complainant charges that said John Legore left a widow named Eliza Legore and the following children to whom said real estate descended as his heirs at law to wit: Barbara Legore of full age, and John Legore, Eliza Jane Legore, Mary Legore, James Legore and Emma Jane Legore all infants and all residents of Frederick County.

Your Complainant further charges that letters of administration upon the personal estate of said John Legore were granted by the Orphans Court for Frederick County to his widow Eliza Legore who has duly entered upon the duties of his said Office, all of which will fully appear by reference to a copy of letters of Administration herewith exhibited marked Exhibit No 6.

Your Complainant further charges that the personal estate of said John Legore is wholly insufficient to pay his debts, and that a sale of his real estate is necessary to pay his debts.

In tender consideration and for as much as your Complainant is remediless in the premises by the strict rules of the common law and only relievable in a Court of Equity where matters of such nature are properly cognizable, and to the end that the said Eliza Legore administratrix of John Legore, Barbara Legore, John Legore, Eliza Jane Legore, Mary Legore, James Legore and Emma Jane Legore and Abraham Myers, may answer the several matters and things hereinbefore stated, and that the real estate aforesaid, or so much thereof as may be necessary to pay the debts of said John Legore, unpaid by the proceeds of the personal estate, may be sold, and that your Complainant may have all such other and further relief in the premises as the nature and Equity of his case may require. May it please your Honor to grant to your Complainant writs of subpoena against Eliza Legore administratrix of the goods, chattels &c of John Legore dec'd; Barbara Legore, John Legore, Eliza Jane Legore, Mary Legore, James Legore Emma Jane Legore and Abraham Myers of Frederick County commanding them to appear in this Court at some certain day to be therein named, to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed therein, and as in duty lie.
