as laid out for John A. Lighter, Trustee in N<sup>o</sup>.

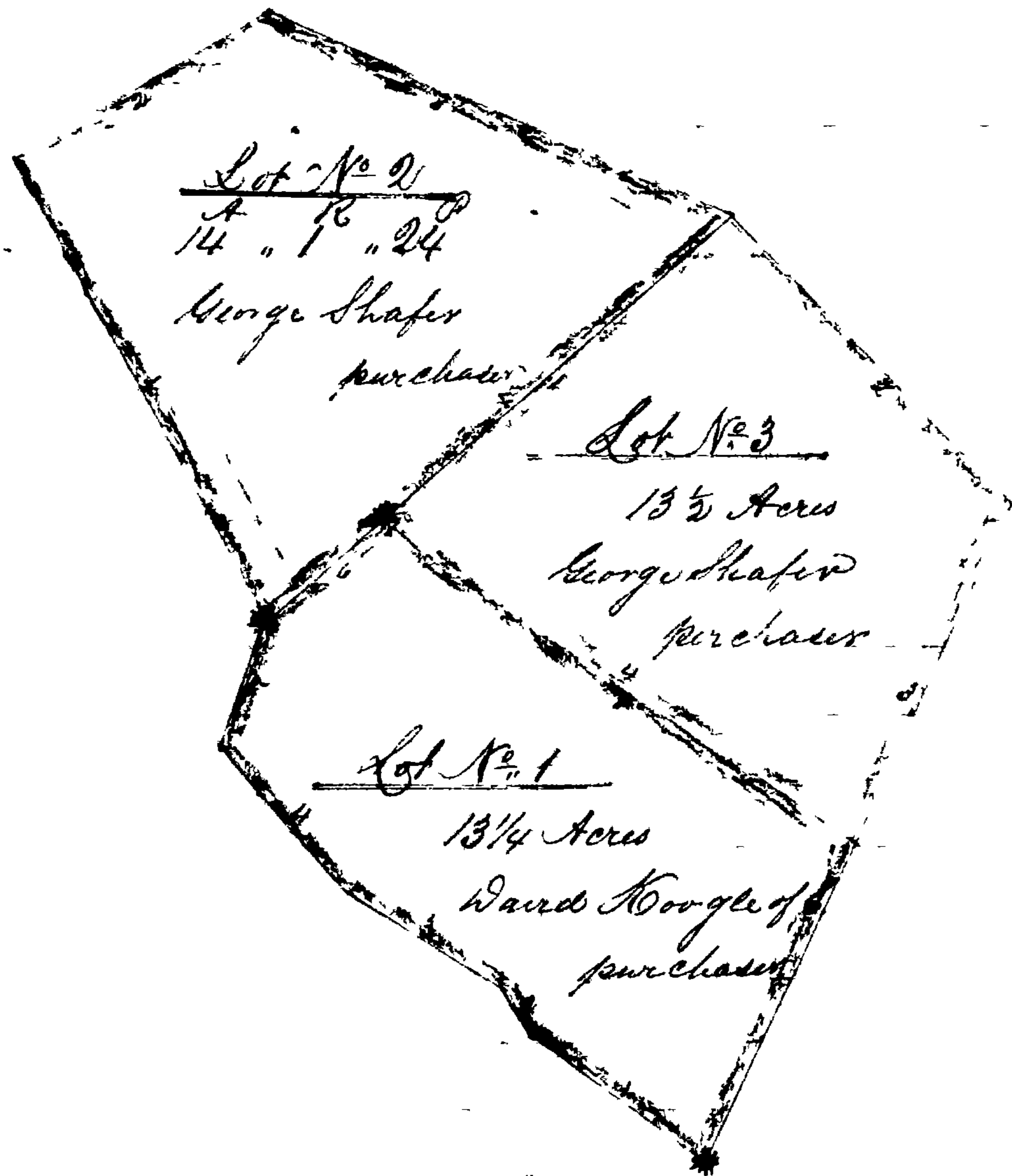
