Griffith, as will appear by said deed of conveyance, a true and certified copy whereof is filed herewith as Exhibit No. 3 ~ That the said Ann Griffith intermarried with one William Watkins and shortly after with her said husband, sold and conveyed their undivided interest in the real estate so as aforesaid devised by said Testator to his said grand children to Lyde Griffith, as will fully appear by the deed of conveyance therefor, a true and certified copy whereof is filed herewith as Exhibit No. 4 ~ That the said Lyde Griffith soon after sold to his Mother, Rachel Griffith, his interest in, being the undivided two ninths of said real estate at and for the sum of Eight hundred Dollars, the whole of which sum said Rachel Griffith paid to said Lyde Griffith, who never executed to said Rachel Griffith a Deed for his said interest. Plummer, the interest of said Rachel Griffith, being the undivided three ninths of said real estate, as will appear by said last Will and Testament, a true and certified extract whereof is filed herewith as Exhibit No. 6 ~ That said Henry A. Griffith sold and conveyed to his brother Charles A. Griffith his interest, being the undivided two ninths of said real estate, as will appear by said Deed, a true and certified copy whereof is filed herewith as Exhibit No. 7. ~ That said Charles A. Griffith in his lifetime made and executed his last Will and Testament in due form of law to pass real estate, and died soon after without having in any manner revoked the same. ~ That said last Will and Testament was duly admitted to probate by the Orphan's Court for Frederick County, and was recorded among the Will Records in the Office of the Register of Wills for said County, and that said Charles A. Griffith in and by his said last Will and Testament amongst other things did devise and bequeath to his Nephew Byron H. Griffith the son, and to Anna Mary Griffith the daughter of Mordecai J.
