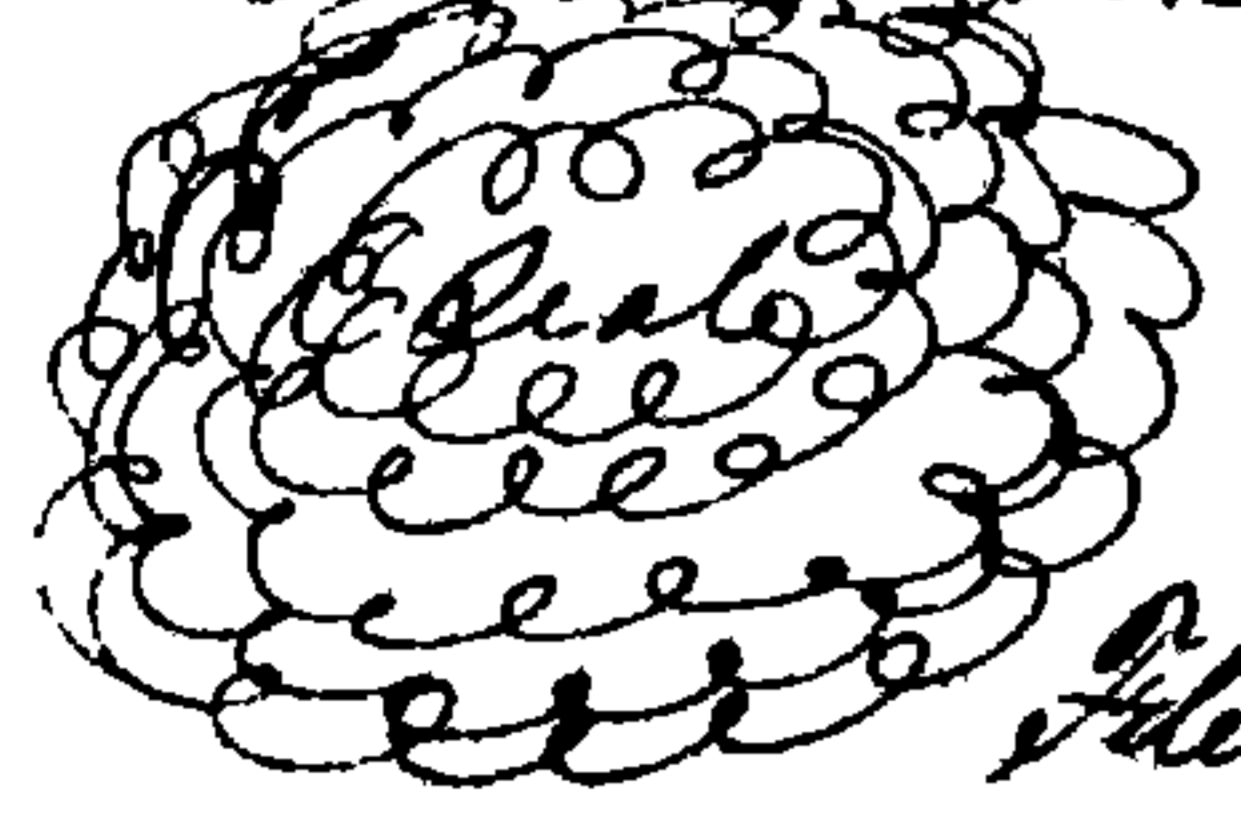

At the request Henry A Griffiths the following Deed is recorded 25th April 1850. ~

This Indenture, made this 28th day of September in the year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred and forty eight, between Philemon Griffiths of Frederick County in the State of Maryland of the one part, and Henry A Griffiths of the County and State aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth, that the said Philemon Griffiths for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred Dollars current money, to him in hand paid by the said Henry A Griffiths, before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof he the said Philemon Griffiths doth hereby acknowledge, and from every part and parcel thereof doth hereby acquit, exonerate, and discharge the said Henry A Griffiths, his heirs, executors & administrators, he the said Philemon Griffiths hath granted, bargained & sold, aliened, conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents, doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, convey and confirm unto the said Henry A Griffiths his heirs, and assigns, all his entire right title and interest in and to that portion of land called "The Rectory on Four Tracts" and since re-named and called the "Additions to Four Tracts" as devised by Col. Philemon Griffiths dec^d to his grand son the aforesaid Philemon Griffiths ~ Together with all and singular the buildings, Improvements and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging, or in any wise appertaining, and all the estate right title and interest whatsoever of him the said Philemon Griffiths, both at law and in Equity, of, in and to & out of the said tract, or parcel of land and premises hereby bargained and sold, or meant, mentioned or intended hereby to be, and every or any part and parcel thereof. ~ I, I have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land, so as aforesaid described called "Four Tracts" and "Additions to Four Tracts", or by whatsoever name the same may be called unto the said Henry A Griffiths his heirs & assigns forever, and to and for no other use intent or purpose, whatsoever, in witness whereof the said Philemon Griffiths hath hereunto subscribed his name and affixed his seal, the day and year first hereinbefore written. ~
