Extract from the Last Will and Testament of Richard W. Griffiths late of Frederick County, deceased, perofated on the 12th day of February 1861.

I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Mary Ellen, all the right, title and interest which I hold in and to my Homestead Farm, and its appurtenances, including the former interests and portions purchased of my two, Lyde and Columbus together with all my Household and Kitchen Furniture whatever, having and excepting the Beds, Bedsteads and Bed Clothing now used and claimed by my sons Charles A. Henry et and John A. Griffiths. I also give and bequeath said daughter Mary Ellen, my family Carriage and my three Horses. And I also give to said daughter Mary Ellen, my negro woman Mary and her child negro woman Maria and Negro "Tom" slaves for life.

At the request of Charles A. Griffiths the following Deed was recorded.

This Indenture made this 27th day of May in the year of our Lord, One thousand eight Hundred and fifty three, between Henry A. Griffiths of Frederick County in the State of Maryland of the one part; and Charles A. Griffiths of the County and State aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth, that for and in consideration of the sum of Eight hundred Dollars, current money, by the said Charles A. Griffiths to the said Henry A. Griffiths in hand paid, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt of which he doth hereby acknowledge, the said Henry A. Griffiths, hath bargained, and sold, aliened and conveyed, and by these presents doth give grant, bargain and sell, alien, convey, release, confirm and confirm, unto the said Charles A. Griffiths his heirs and assigns, all the two ninths of an undivided part or parcel of land lying and being in Frederick County, being the Recovery on Four Tracts; and since recovered, and called the "Addition to Four Tracts"; one ninth the said Henry A. Griffiths hold by the Will of Philemon Griffiths, and the one ninth he purchased of Philemon Griffiths son of Lemuel Griffiths, as by reference to the Will of Philemon Griffiths, Recorded in Liber B. M. C. No. 2 folios 309 &c on the Register of Wills, and the one ninth by a reference to a Deed Recorded in the Clerks Office, from Philemon Griffiths, to Henry Griffiths, well more fully appear; Also a reference to said Will will more fully appear; together with all and singular the buildings, improvements ways, waters, water courses, rights, members, privileges, advantages and appurtenances thereto belonging to the said two ninths of said undivided lands, or in any wise appertaining, and all the Estate, right title and interest, trust, property, claim and demands whatsoever at Law and in Equity of him the said Henry A. Griffiths, of, in and to, the same. So Have and to Hold the said herein referred to and described premises, with the appurtenances thereunto belonging, unto the said Charles A. Griffiths his heirs and assigns, to the only proper use of the said Charles A. Griffiths his heirs and assigns forever.
