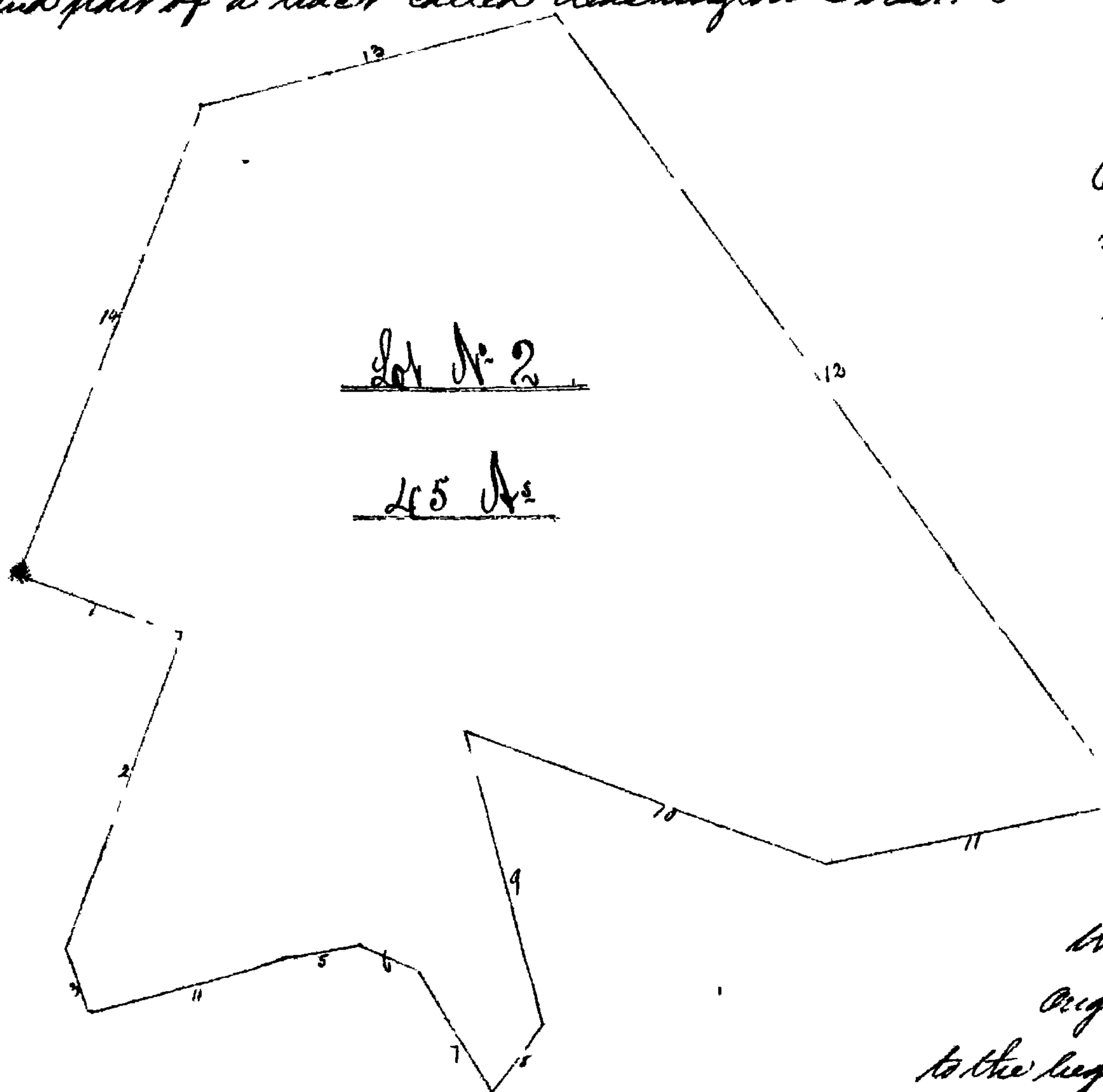


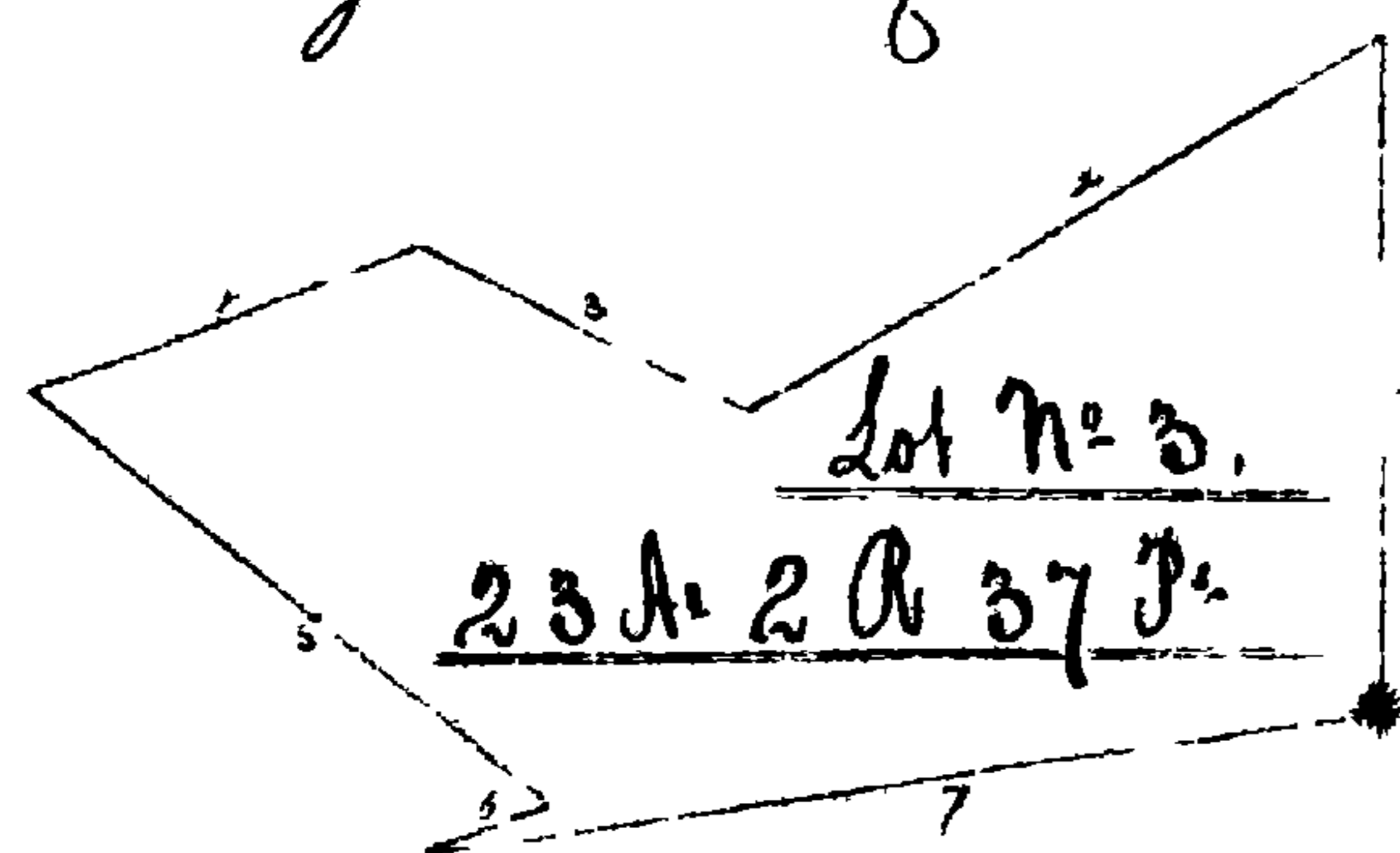

Beginning for the outlines of said Lot No. 2, at a planted stone standing at or near the end of 34 feet on the 37 line of Long Tract, being also on the 106 line of Mount Acton, and on the first line of Washington Forest, said stone being also the beginning of the deed from Mr Price and Dr Anderson to Joseph Nicholas, bearing date June 29<sup>th</sup> 1840, and recorded in Liber G. G. folio 345 1/2. One of the Land Records of Washington County and running thence correcting the whole survey so as to agree with its original location, S 69° E 18 feet S 18° W 36 feet to the beginning of the deed from Samuel Douth and wife to Joseph Nicholas dated April 2<sup>nd</sup> 1842 and recorded in Liber A. W. C. C. folio 330 of Liber No. 2, one of the Land Records of Frederick County and running thence S 19 7/4° E 6 7/10 feet N 76° E 21 7/10 feet N 81° E 8 7/10 feet S 65° E 6 7/10 feet S 29 7/2° E 15 feet N 37° E 9 feet to intersect the first line of 'Sam Head it is no word', and with said line to the end thereof N 14° W 31 7/10 feet S 69° E 44 feet N 80° E 32 7/2 feet N 35° W 103 7/2 feet S 77° W 39 feet to a planted stone at the end of stone fence, then S 19 7/2° W 53 7/2 feet to the beginning containing forty five acres of land. ~

Outlines of Lot No. 3 Situated in Washington County and being part of a tract of land called 'Sweepstakes'; and the same lot which Joseph Nicholas obtained from Peter Faulder and Solomon Faulder by deed dated Sept 1<sup>st</sup> 1857, and recorded among the land records of Washington County. ~



Beginning for the same at a Chestnut tree standing at the South East corner of said tract and running thence N 1° E 4 7/10 feet S 59 7/2° W 60 7/4 feet N 62 7/2° W 31 feet S 70° W 35 feet S 57 7/2° E 53 7/2 feet S 76 7/4° W 10 feet then with a straight line to the beginning containing 23 A. 2 R. 37 P. of land. ~
