

North 67 1/4 West 32 feet. Iron stone, North 43 1/4 West 40 feet. Iron stone South 61 1/4 West 5 1/10 feet. Iron stone planted on a line of the deed from Joshua Warfield to Jacob Rupp then then with and bounding on the lines of said deed allowing 2' for retrograde variation South 13 East 47 1/2 feet. Iron stone, South 82 East 8 feet to the end of the 6th line of the deed from Caspar Devilbiss to John Strawberger aforesaid, then with and bounding on the lines thereof correcting courses and distances to correspond with their settled location here-tofore by parties interested South 11 West 29 1/4 feet South 82 West 18 feet South 1/2 East 6 1/2 feet then by a line of division South 55 1/2 East 55 1/4 feet to intersect the third line of the aforesaid deed and then bounding thereon North 11 1/2 East 53 feet to the place of beginning containing 19 1/4 acres and 13 feet of land more or less. Together with the water rights and privileges thereto belonging for the use of the Mill as originally conveyed by Caspar Devilbiss to John Strawberger in a deed bearing date the 6th day of April 1813 and recorded in Liber H. R. No 45 folio 107 of the Land Records of Frederick County, in fee simple, with the exception of a right reserved to use water from the Spring for family and dairy purposes with a free path to same through the lot on which said Spring is situated and the said Jacob H. Hall to keep the fence or water rack across the race in repair on the lands of said Henry Hartrock and no other.

At the request of Henry Hartrock the following agreement was recorded May 28 1858.

This indenture made this 24th day of August Anno Domini 1854 between Henry Hartrock and Lydia A. Corner both of Frederick in the State of Maryland. Whereas a marriage is about to be solemnized between the said parties and they have each ipse living from former marriages by them severally had with consorts now deceased, and upon the treaty for their said marriage it has been agreed by and between the said Henry and Lydia that their respective rights of property arising out of the marital relation should be restricted and defined as hereinafter done.

Now this indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the several stipulations and concessions by the said Lydia hereinafter made as also in consideration of the sum of one dollar by her in hand paid and of said intended marriage the said Henry Hartrock hath given, granted, bargained and sold and by these presents doth give, grant, bargain and sell unto the said Lydia A. Corner for and during the term of her natural life all that tract, piece or parcel of land containing about forty acres more or less, being all that portion of the two parcels of land described in and conveyed by a certain deed from Jacob Rupp & Mary Ann his wife to said Henry Hartrock dated April Anno Domini 1854 and which lies southwardly of the public road leading through the same and being also so much of said two parcels as is not embraced in the portion of said two parcels heretofore sold or contracted to be sold by said Henry to Jacob H. Hall.

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
