

some newspaper printed in Frederick County and such other notice as he may deem proper of the time, place, manner and terms of sale, which terms of sale shall be as follows and half of the purchase money shall be paid on the day of sale or the ratification thereof and the balance in one year from the day of sale to be secured by the bond of the purchaser or purchasers bearing interest from the day of sale, with surety to be approved by the Trustee and on the payment of the whole of the purchase money, and not before the Trustee shall by a good and sufficient deed of conveyance to be executed and acknowledged according to law convey to the purchaser or purchasers the property so purchased by him, her or them free clear and discharged of and from all claim of the parties complainants and defendants in this suit, and as soon as may be convenient after such sale the Trustee shall make to this Court a full report of his proceedings as such Trustee with an affidavit of the truth thereof and of the fairness of such sale and shall bring into this Court the money the proceeds of such sale to be disposed of under the order of this Court among the parties entitled thereto, after deducting therefrom the expenses of such sale and the costs of this suit to be taxed by the Clerk and such commission as this Court shall think proper to allow to the Trustee in consideration of the skill, attention and fidelity whereunto he shall appear to have discharged his trust ~
