Presented that heretofore Court on the 14th day of October 1865 came the said complainants in Court here sitting by Grayson Eichelberger Solicitor and filed in Court here the following Bill and Exhibits.

Bill

In the Hon. William Nelson Judge of the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting as a Court of Equity.

The bill of complaint of Benjamin Moffett Jr and Drusella J Moffett his wife respectfully shew unto your Honor that a certain Benjamin Moffett was in his lifetime indebted unto a certain Elizabeth A Moffett in the sum of Eleven hundred and thirty six dollars and eighty nine cents by his single bill bearing date on and interest from the first day of January in the year Eighteen hundred and fifty seven and payable twelve months from the date thereof, as will appear by said single bill filed herewith as Exhibit No 1, which with all other Exhibits your Orator pray may be taken as a part of this their bill of Complaint as if here inserted in words and figures that the said Elizabeth A Moffett sometime after departed this life, having previously made and executed her last will and testament, whereby she constituted and appointed your Orator, Benjamin Moffett Jr, as her Executor that your Orator assumed and took upon himself said trust as will appear by the Exemplification of the letters testamentary filed herewith as Exhibit No 2 that the said Benjamin Moffett Sr died in September in the year Eighteen hundred and sixty five intestate, seized and possessed of a house and lot of ground particularly described in a deed from Daniel Rhodes and wife, a true and certified copy whereof is filed herewith as Exhibit No 3 that the said Benjamin Moffett died leaving the whole of the money specified in said single bill unpaid and due with interest from the date thereof that he died leaving your Orator Benjamin Moffett Jr, Ellen E. intermarried with Benjamin J Snouffer, who were his children and John B. Snouffer Malinda Snouffer and Virginia Snouffer, children of his deceased daughter Malinda, as his only heirs at law, to whom said land descended that letters of administration on the personal estate of said intestate were by the Orphan's Court of Frederick County granted to your Orator, Benjamin Moffett Jr, as will appear by the Exemplification thereof filed herewith as Exhibit No 4 that the personal estate of said intestate is inconsiderable, insufficient to pay the debts due and owing by him and is insolvent and your Orator who files this bill as well for himself as for all other creditors of said intestate who will come in & contribute to the expenses of this suit, is advised that said single bill has devolved upon him as Executor aforesaid and that he is entitled to have said real estate sold for the payment thereof. Your Orator further shew that said John B. Snouffer, Malinda Snouffer and Virginia Snouffer are infants under the age of twenty one years. In tender consideration whereof and
