I give and bequeath unto Alexander Caldwell, John Caldwell, Elizabeth Caldwell and Mary Caldwell all my personal property I have, I have and to hold the same jointly during their natural life. — Then I give and bequeath unto Alexander Caldwell, John Caldwell, Elizabeth Caldwell and Mary Caldwell my natural brothers and sisters my plantation wherem I now reside known by the name of The Rectory or Dam Head containing one hundred and thirty two and one fourth acre of land. To have and to hold the same jointly during their natural lives and after the death of the above named Alexander Caldwell, John Caldwell, Elizabeth Caldwell and Mary Caldwell then the above named farm is, and shall be to all intents and purposes the right and estate of David Caldwell and Christian Caldwell children of William Caldwell and their heirs forever. — It is my wish that my brothers Alexander Caldwell and John Caldwell my sisters Elizabeth Caldwell and Mary Caldwell to defray the expenses of my funeral and all just debts, and upon refusal or neglect, then I hereby authorize and empower my hereinafter named Executor to sell and convey by good and sufficient deed of conveyance any amount of land of my said farm I now reside on next the Gettysburg and Emmelshurg Road to defray the expenses aforesaid. — And lastly I hereby constitute and appoint my Brother William Caldwell to be my sole Executor of this my last will and Testament, revoking and annulling all former wills by me heretofore made ratifying and confirming this and now other to be my last will and Testament. — In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 23^d day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty eight signed sealed, published and declared by James Caldwell the above named testator, as and for his last will and Testament in presence of us, who at his request, in his presence, and the presence of each other have subscribed our names as witnesses thereto, Sam^l. At the request of Christian Caldwell the following deed is recorded the 22nd day of May 1834. —

This Indenture made the 12th day of April Eighteen hundred and thirty four between David Caldwell of Frederick County and State of Maryland of the one part and Christian Caldwell sister of the said David Caldwell of the same County and State of the other part, Witnesseth that the said David Caldwell for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars current money to him in hand paid by the said Christian Caldwell before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof to the said David Caldwell doth hereby acknowledge hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, convey and confirm unto the said Christian Caldwell her heirs and assigns, the following described part of the tract of land called 'Dam Head' lying and being in the County and State aforesaid and beginning for the same at a stone planted at the end of the third line of the whole tract called 'Dam Head' and running thence as viz; South 5 3/4 deg East 75 feet to a stone planted, North 42 3/4 deg East 54 feet to a stone planted South 49 deg East 28 feet to a stone planted North 53 1/2 deg East 33 feet to a stone planted South 58 degrees East 55 feet to a heap of stones South 2 deg East 26 feet to a stone planted South 25 degrees West 71 1/10 feet to a stone planted and a corner of a lot of said land William Gresson purchased from said David Caldwell containing three acres of land thence with said line also the division line cutting off therefrom one other lot of said tract sold also to said Christian
