To the fourth Int. That he was acquainted with Christina Sweeney formerly a resident of Frederick County, Maryland, that she is dead, that she died in Frederick County aforesaid, on the 26th day of March Eighteen Hundred and fifty four. ~

To the 5th Int. That said Christina Sweeney was married at the time of her death to James Sweeney one of the defendants in her husband and resides in Annettaburg District, Frederick County Maryland. ~

To the 6th Int. That the said Christina Sweeney left the following children, namely, Mary E aged about twenty three years, married to William Hand; Frances, adult, married to Thomas Smith; Agnes, adult, married to Moses Esterline; Martha Jane Sweeney, adult; Christina aged about nineteen years, married to William Kennedy and William M. and Columbia Sweeney infants under the age of twenty one years; that they all reside in the State of Pennsylvania except William M Sweeney, who resides in Frederick County, Maryland and Columbia Sweeney who is deceased. ~

To the 7th Int. That he was acquainted with Columbia Sweeney, daughter of said Christina Sweeney that she is dead, that she died about ten years since, intestate and unmarried without any issue. ~

To the 8th Int. That the lands described in Exhibit No 2, cannot be divided amongst the heirs at law of said Christina Sweeney, without loss and injury to the parties interested, for the reasons that if they were divided, the parcels would not admit of advantageous cultivation and they would sell at a much less sum of money than if they were all sold together. ~

To the 9th Int. That he knows nothing further. ~

To the 3rd Int. That he knows the lands of which Christina Sweeney died, seized and possessed, that he now looks at Exhibit No 2, now here shown him; that the said lands lie and are situate in Annettaburg District, Frederick County Maryland and contain upwards of one hundred acres. ~

To the 4th Int. That he was acquainted with Christina Sweeney formerly a resident of Frederick County aforesaid, that she is dead; that she died in the County aforesaid during the month of March in the year Eighteen Hundred and fifty four. ~

To the 5th Int. That said Christina Sweeney was married at the time of her death, that James Sweeney one of the defendants in this cause is her husband and that he resides in Annettaburg District Frederick County, Maryland. ~

To the 6th Int. That said Christina Sweeney left the following children, namely; Mary Elizabeth married to William Hand; Frances, married to Thomas Smith; Agnes, married to Moses Esterline; Martha Jane Sweeney, adult; Christina, married to William Kennedy; William M and Columbia Sweeney, infants under the age of twenty one years, who all reside out
