 the stock in shatter shop and all debts due me by note or book account, the above
 bequests shall be for the sole use and benefit of my wife so long as she may live, and
 after the death of my dear wife, the above described property shall be sold and equally
 divided among my dear children share and share alike, and lastly, I do hereby constitute
 and appoint my dear wife to be my executrix and my son Alpheus, to be my Executor of
 this my last will and Testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and seal this 14th day of December Eighteen hundred and sixty two.

Extract Copy from the will of Philip Appleman late of Frederick County dec^d
 Executed on the 14th day of Oct 1830 and admitted to probate on the 28th day of Oct 1830.

It is my desire and will that all my property of whatever character both real
 and personal, shall be my loving and affectionate wife's during her life, and so long as she
 may live, she is to own, use, and exercise her ownership over the same, without molestation
 or hindrance designing thereby as a protection to my dear wife Mary, and further the
 placing the means in her control for the future protection and support of my dear daugh-
 ters and further I wish it to be understood, and particularly hereafter attended to, that
 when my dear wife shall die, then and not till then, shall all my property (as above
 in trust to my dear wife), be carefully appraised, after which it is my will and I do
 desire that my sons John and Jacob, jointly or separately as they may agree, shall have
 the privilege of taking my money with the stock and implements belonging thereto,
 at such price as the same was appraised.

 was recorded October 20 1856.

This indenture made this 12th day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and
 fifty four, by and between David Coblenz, Elias Coblenz, and Joseph Coblenz, Executors of
 the last will and Testament of John Coblenz, late of Frederick County dec^d of the first part;
 and John Appleman of the other part. Witnesses, that Whereas the said John Coblenz dec^d
 by his last will and Testament bearing date the 18th day of July 1846, and recorded in the
 Office of Register of Wills in said County, as well appear by reference thereto being had, did
