At the request of John Appelman the following deed was recorded June 30 1857.

This deed made this 25th day of April in the year 1857 by Catharine Appelman, Elizabeth Appelman and Sarah Appelman of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, Uniteneth that in consideration of two hundred and twenty two dollars and fifty five Cents, the said Catharine Appelman, Elizabeth Appelman and Sarah Appelman, do grant unto John Appelman of said County and State, all that part of a tract and parcel of land lying and being in the County and State aforesaid being part of a tract of land called "Pleasant Ridge" Beginning at the end of 29 feet on the 16: line of the whole tract aforesaid, and running thence by virtue the outlines thereof North 43 deg East 21 feet to a stone North 7 deg East 22 feet to a stone North 27 deg East 21 feet to a stone now planted then leaving said outlines and by a dividing line now made, North 13 deg West 40 feet to a stone now planted on the 8: line of said Catharine Elizabeth and Sarah Appelmans part of said land then with said 8: line South 27 1/2 deg West 50 feet to the end of the 4: line of the deed from said John Appelman to Peter Schlosser for 20 acres then with said line reversed, South 48 1/2 deg East 42 feet to the beginning containing 14 acres 3 rods and 15 square perches of land more or less in fee simple being part of the same land which the said Catharine Appelman, Elizabeth Appelman and Sarah Appelman obtained from John Appelman Executor of Philip Appelman late of the County and State aforesaid deceased) by deed dated on the 30: day of August 1856 and recorded in Liber C. G. 117 folio 710. One of the Land Records of Frederick County as by reference to the same will more fully appear: ~

Witness our hands and seals, Catharine Appelman Elizabeth Appelman Sarah Appelman

Which was thus done my State of Maryland Frederick County to wit: I hereby certify that on this 25th day of April in the year 1857 before the subscriber a Justice of the peace of the State of Maryland in and for Frederick County, personally appeared Catharine Appelman, Elizabeth Appelman and Sarah Appelman and acknowledged the aforesaid deed to be their act.

At the request of Philip Appelman the following deed was recorded 15: April 1790 to wit:

This Indenture made this day of in the year of our Lord seventeen hundred and ninety, between Conrad Kerne son of Frederick County and State of Maryland Farmer of the one part and Philip Appelman of the County and State aforesaid Farmer of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Conrad Kerne for and consideration of the sum of ten pounds current money to him in hand paid by the said Philip Appelman, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and thereof and every part and parcel thereof doth acquit and discharge the said Philip Appelman his heirs and assigns forever, both granted, bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell unto the said Philip Appelman his heirs and assigns forever, all his right title and interest of two lots or portion of grounds lying and being in Middletown in the County and State aforesaid, Number thirty two and thirty three, containing one acre of ground, to have and to hold the said lots or portion of ground, and premises unto him the said Philip Appelman his heirs and assigns forever and to no other use interest or purpose whatsoever, and the said Conrad Kerne doth covenant
