The object of this suit is to procure a decree for a sale of certain mortgage premises in Frederick County State of Maryland mortgaged by a certain David Hill of Frederick County to Howard Maynard. The Bill states that a certain David Hill of Frederick County State of Maryland being indebted to Howard Maynard of the County and State aforesaid by his single bill dated on the 17th day of November Eighteen hundred and thirty eight in the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars and to secure the payment of said single bill did on the 12th day of January Eighteen hundred and thirty nine, execute his deed of mortgage to the said Howard Maynard conveying certain real estate in Frederick County State aforesaid it being part of a tract of land called "The Middle Plantation", containing about fourteen acres and three quarters of land more or less upon condition that it be void on payment of the said sum of one hundred and fifty dollars with interest from the 17th day of November 1838.
