At the request of Leonard Pickens the following deed was recorded November 16<sup>th</sup> 1860. ~  
 This Deed made this Eleventh day of October in the year Eighteen hundred and sixty by James Milton Geyer of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, Merchant, that whereas James Milton Geyer in his own right and as agent for Jacob Gillis and Caroline L. Gillis of Parson's Kentucky and for Eliza Ann Hammond by their several letters of attorney duly executed and recorded among the Land Records of Frederick County did on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of September 1860, sell at public sale the following described lots and lands at New Market in said County, being the same lands and lots devised by John Geyer late of Frederick County to his children to Leonard Pickens for the sum of four thousand and fourteen dollars <sup>12<sup>cts</sup></sup> and the purchase money therefor having been duly paid and satisfied the said James Milton Geyer hath agreed to execute these presents. ~ Now therefore in consideration of the premises the said James Milton Geyer doth grant unto Leonard Pickens, all the lots or parts of lots of land as conveyed to said James Geyer by Eli Elliott by lease and deed on the 14<sup>th</sup> of June 1816 and by Thomas Wood and by Thomas Wood in 1812, and by William Summers in 1820, designated in the plat of New Market as Lot 20 27, also 4 1/4 acres lying between the road leading to Mountain Depot, which was conveyed by Nicholas Pitts to James Geyer on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of June 1831, being part of New Market's Plains, also ~
