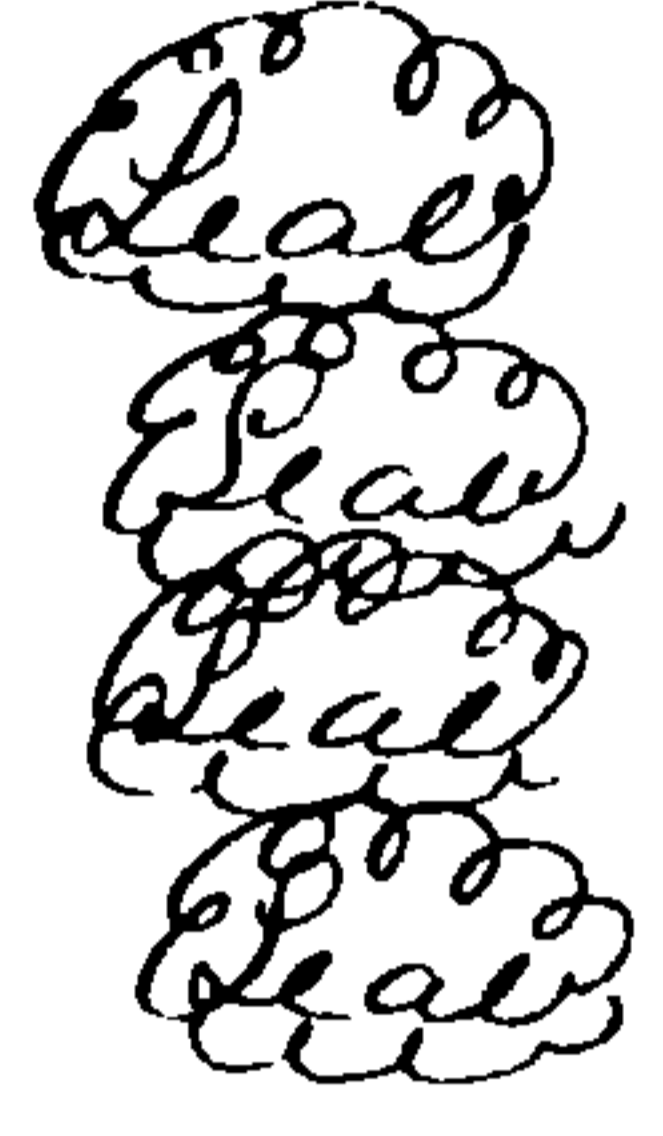

And to sell the real and personal estate therein mentioned does & so shows that after giving bond with security for the faithful discharge of his trust as required by the said decree and giving notice of the time place manner and terms of sale as prescribed by the decree in the Frederick Citizen and by handbills extensively circulated he did pursuant to said notice attend on the premises on Tuesday the 16th day of March 1858 and then and there proceeded to sell the said real estate as follows in the first place your justice offered at public sale to the highest bidder the farm the home place of said William Delaplaine deceased containing one hundred and twenty nine and a half acres and ten perches of land and a wood lot attached to said farm containing six acres and eighty eight perches of land situated in Frederick County State of Maryland about two miles from Newburgh on the road leading from thence to Emmittsburg adjoining the lands of Nathan Baker Solomon Rank Owen Wagner and Dana Wagner and sold the same to Jacob Delaplaine at and for the sum of \$18.70 cents per acre he being the highest and best bidder for the same In the next place your Justice offered for sale the personal property directed by the said William Delaplaine to be sold and sold the same to sundry persons for the sum
