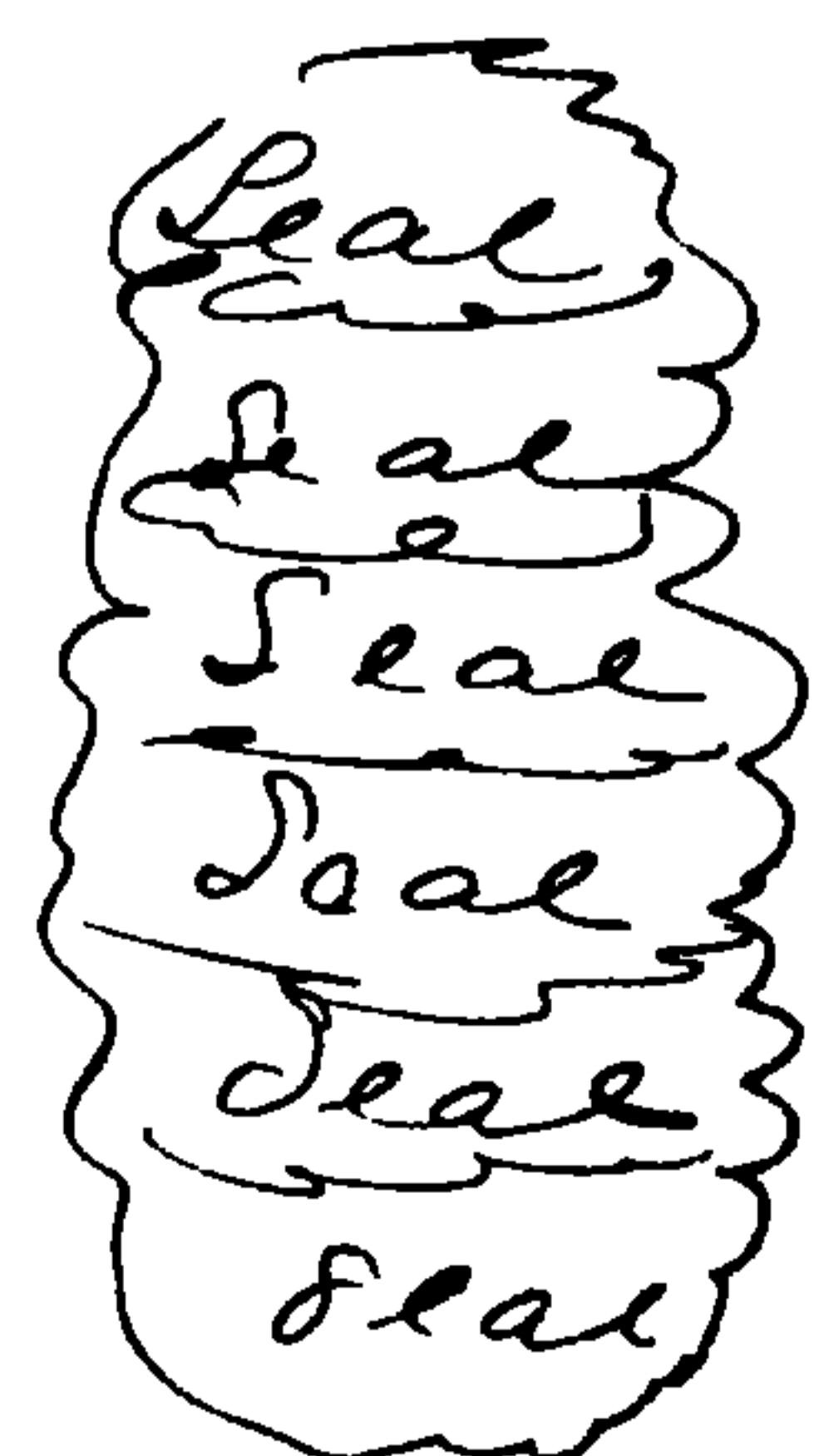


Conveying the title of the several parts of the real estate

jointly and severally firmly by these presents made  
with our seals and dated this 25<sup>th</sup> day of January  
1859. Whereas by a decree of the Circuit Court for  
Frederick County sitting as a Court of Equity bearing  
date on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of November 1858 and passed in  
a cause No 2781 in the said Court wherein the  
said George Schley and wife James M Schley and  
wife are Complainants and William Henry  
Schley Buchanan Schley and others are Defendants  
the above bound George Schley and James M Schley  
have been appointed trustees to make sale of  
certain real estate in the proceedings in said  
Cause mentioned Upon the condition of the above  
obligation is such that if the above bound George  
Schley and James M Schley do and shall  
well and faithfully perform the trust reposed  
in them by said decree or that may be upon  
in them by any future decree or order in the  
premises then the above obligation to be void  
otherwise to remain in full force and virtue  
in Law
