 further charges that, since the life time of the said
 Berman and since his death two of the before a instal
 ments or annual payments of the said purchase money
 of fifteen hundred and ninety one dollar and ninety
 three cents each amounting to the sum of \$2958.50 have
 become due and payable to your oratory by the terms
 of the said Contract and Rate and are still owing
 to your oratory with interest from the first day of October
 eighteen hundred and fifty eight and also two annual
 payments of interest on the whole of said before payments
 of six hundred and forty five dollars and sixteen cents
 each amounting to the sum of \$1290.00 have become
 due and payable to your oratory and still remain
 unpaid and in arrears making the part of the purchase
 money of said tract of land so sold as aforesaid and
 the interest thereon now or due and unpaid to your
 oratory amount to the sum of \$304.66 with addition
 of interest on several parts thereof as herebefore set forth
 to your Honor, and your oratory states further to your
 Honor that there remains four other instalments of seven
 hundred and ninety one dollar and ninety
 three cents each on the gross sum of \$7167.72 unpaid
 and to become due according to the terms of the Contract
 and as aforesaid with interest from the first day of Oct.
 1858 as per statement herewith filed Marked D and your
 oratory charges that the said Berman on the eleventh
 day of June 1858 died intestate in Frederick County aforesaid
 leaving an widow named Mary Berman and James
 Calvin Berman, Martin Thomas Berman, George Albert Berman,
 Anne Mary Berman, William Bayard Berman and John
 Clarence Berman his children and heirs at law all of
 which said children are infants under the age of twenty
 one year, and your oratory charges that all the said parties
 reside in Frederick County Maryland and your oratory
 further charges that administration of all and singular
 the personal estate of the said Berman deceased
 hath been granted by the orphans Court of Frederick County
 unto a Captain John B. Thomas of said County who in
 virtue thereof has proposed a return of the said personal
 estate of considerable value but your oratory is informed
 and charges that the said personal estate of the said deceased
 is wholly insufficient to pay the debts of the said deceased
