No. 2793 Equity. In the Circuit Court for
 Frederick County sitting as a Court of Equity,
 July & Term 1859

This case stands on record for hearing and
 being submitted to the Court upon the Bill answering and
 other proceedings, are read and considered. It is therefore
 this 25th day of August 1859 by Hon. James Nelson Judge of the
 Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting as a Court of Equity
 and by the authority of the said Court ordered and adjudged
 and decreed that unless the said Mary A. Bayley administratrix
 of William Bayley dec'd. or some one for her shall on or before
 the first Monday of September next pay or bring into this
 Court to be paid to the Complainant the sum of two
 thousand dollars or the interest thereon from the first
 day of April 1856 till paid or brought into this Court to
 be paid the sum actually due on said mortgage at the
 time of filing the Bill in this case together with the
 costs of this Court to be taxed by the Clerk the mortgaged
 premises in the proceedings mentioned or so much thereof
 as may be necessary for the purpose he sold by a trustee
 that the said Joshua Dill of the County of Frederick be and
 he is hereby appointed trustee to make said sale and
 that the course and manner of his proceedings shall be
 as follows. He shall & if he is in this case with the
 Clerk of this Court & bring to the state of Maryland
 executed by himself with good receipt to be affirmed
 as required by Law for the sum of two thousand
 dollars conditioned for the performance of the
