The above cause standing ready for a hearing and being submitted the Bill answers exhibits and all other proceedings were by the Court read & considered It is thereupon the third day of February in the year 1859 by Madison Nelson Circuit Judge for the third Judicial District of the State of Maryland and by the authority of the Circuit Court for Frederick County as a Court of Equity ordered adjudged and decreed that the real estate wherof Christian Smith late of Frederick County deceased died seized and possessed be sold for the payment of his debt and that George Smith of Frederick County be and he is hereby appointed trustee to make such sale and that the course & manner of his proceedings shall be as follows he shall first file with the Clerk of this Court a bond to the State of Maryland to be executed by himself and two or more securities to be approved by the Court or the Clerk thereof in the penalty of forty thousand Dollars conditioned for the faithful discharge of the trust reposed in him by the decree or orders may be reversed in here by any other decree or order in the premises He shall then proceed to sell said real estate either at public or private sale in whole or in parcels as may be in his judgment most beneficial for all parties creditors and here if sold at public sale he shall give at least three weeks previous notice of the time place manner and terms of sale in a newspaper or newspapers published in Frederick County which terms of sale
