 Frederick on the 17th day of January 1860: That
 Isaac Deibel a witness of lawful age produced on the
 part of Complainants and examined to interrogatories
 filed with the Commissioners by the Solicitor for Complainants
 and hereunto returned, deposed and says to the 1st Interrogatory
 I do know them to the second they are all over age except
 Thomas Carter to the 3rd He is dead he died in January 1859
 and left a widow Catharine Carter and the following children
 to wit John Carter who married Catharine Lopen Bryan
 & Carter Mellean Carter Anne Duncan married to Henry
 Duncan Mogg & Carter James Carter who married Elizabeth
 Key and Thomas C Carter by the 4th Interrogatory He
 did not administer on the estate and sell the personal
 property which amounted to \$132.00 and the debts to my
 knowledge amounted to \$400.00 I know these facts as a duly
 sworn juror by the 5th Interrogatory I do it is to the 6th I
 have looked at the note marked Exhibit B and the account
 marked Exhibit A and I think they are just & true & have not
 been paid There being no further testimony and no further
 time being desired for the production of the same & being closed
 this Commission and hereunto return hereon this 17th day
