As to the 7th Interrogatory I think not it is too small for advantageous division. As to the 8th Interrogatory I think it would be to the benefit of all parties concerned to have said property sold. As to the 9th Interrogatory I know nothing further also at the same time and place B A Cunningham a witness of lawful age produced on the part of Complainant being duly sworn and examined to interrogatories filed in the Commissioner as aforesaid and returned as aforesaid deposes and says As to the 1st Interrogatory I know all the parties to this suit except Thyma Baldwin and George Moberly. As to the 2nd Interrogatory I did he is dead he died about 12 years ago in the neighborhood of Buckeystown. As to the 3rd Interrogatory He had she died. She was prior to the institution of this suit she died more than a year ago. As to the 4th Interrogatory She had all that I know since then Mrs Shaw Mrs Brough and Mrs Fulton are residents of Frederick County John is a resident of Baltimore City. When the other reside I do not know. Mrs Moberly is dead she left a child that I have seen but whether it is living or not I do not know. As to the 5th Interrogatory I do not know positively but to the best of my knowledge she died without will. As to the 6th Interrogatory I know the property described in the deed marked Exhibit A now shown me it is the property of which Reginald Baldwin died seized and possessed. As to the 7th Interrogatory I do not think it susceptible of division among the heirs for the reason that it is too small. As to the 8th Interrogatory It would be to the advantage of all parties concerned to have said property sold. As to the 9th Interrogatory I know nothing further. There being no further testimony and no further time being required for the production of witnesses I herewith return this day filed in this cause marked Exhibit A and close this Commission and herewith return the same under my hand and seal this 20th day of March 1860
