To the Honorable the Judges of Frederick County Court sitting
as a Court of Equity. The Bill of Complaint of Daniel
Moan administrator of Daniel Blickenstaff filed in behalf
of himself and other creditors of William Draper deceased
who may hereafter come in, as parties to this suit respectfully
sheweth that at October Term of Frederick County Court 1845
a certain Daniel Blickenstaff late of Frederick County deceased
obtained judgment against said William Draper for the
sum of two hundred and forty four dollars and seventy
eight cents with interest from the 27th day of February
1845 and four dollars and seventy eight and a third cents
That said Daniel Blickenstaff dying upon Complaintant
was duly appointed by the Orphan Court of Frederick County
administrator of the personal estate of said Daniel Blickenstaff
and as such administrator revived the said judgment
by writ of Habeas facia at February Court 1845 as will
be seen by reference to No 61 Trials H. C. 1845 upon Complaintant
