 Court as a Court of Equity  
 July Term 1857

The object of this suit is to procure  
 a decree for the sale of the real estate whereof William Draper &  
 late of Frederick County State of Maryland and seized and  
 proposed for the payment of his debts. The Bill states that Daniel  
 Blickenstaff obtained Judgment against said William Draper Sr  
 in Frederick County Court October Term 1843 for two hundred  
 and fifty four dollars and seventy eight cents with interest  
 from the 27th day of February 1843 and four dollars and seventy  
 eight and a third cents. That Daniel Blickenstaff dying  
 intestate the Complainant was duly appointed his administrator  
 and as such administrator made said Judgment against said  
 William Draper at February Term of said Court 1844 that a  
 writ of fieri facias was issued on said Judgment to remain  
 returnable by October Term 1845 which was returned by the  
 Sheriff of Frederick County "Nulla Bona" The Bill further  
 states that William Draper died intestate in the year 1857  
 seized and proposed of a part of a tract of land situated in  
 Frederick County State of Maryland called the range about  
 the three Marshall Knobs containing two hundred and seven  
 acres of land and a piece or parcel of land called by some  
 name to the Complainant unknown situated in the Middle town  
 District in Frederick County containing twenty eight acres of  
 land more or less by a certain summons to said William  
 Draper Sr. The Bill further states that said William Draper  
 at the time of his death left no personal estate and that no  
 letters of administration were or was taken out he leaving no estate  
 to be administered that at the time of his death the said  
 William Draper Sr left the following children as he has at  
 Law to whom said lands descended as tenants in common to  
 Jmt Andrew Draper who has become an applicant for the  
 Insolvent Laws Joshua Dill being his trustee Isaac Draper  
 who has become an applicant for the benefit of the Insolvent  
 Laws David Wolfe Sr being his trustee a daughter named Josephine  
 who married a man named Samuel Hay and lives with her  
 husband in the state of Pennsylvania William Draper David  
 Draper Joseph Draper and Elizabeth who married a certain  
 man named Struffer and with her husband lives beyond  
 the limits of the State of Maryland. The Bill states that the  
 intestate left no personal estate to pay his debts and that
