The above cause standing ready for a hearing and being submitted The Bill order of publication - exhibits depositions and all other proceedings were by the Court read and considered and it appearing to the Court that the Complainant is entitled to the relief prayed for it is thereupon the 3^d day of May 1852 by Madison Nelson Judge of the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting in Equity and by the authority of said Court ordered adjudged and decreed that the bill of Complainant as to the non resident defendants be and the same is hereby taken pro Confess and it is further ordered adjudged and decreed that the land and premises mentioned in these proceedings be sold at public sale and that Daniel Mann of Frederick County be and he is hereby appointed a trustee to make said sale and that the course and manner of his proceedings shall be as follows. He shall first file with the Clerk of the Court a bond to the state of Maryland to be executed by himself and one or more sureties to be approved by this Court or by the Clerk thereof in the penalty of twelve hundred dollars conditioned for the faithful performance of the trusts reposed in him by this decree or which may be reposed in him by this decree or which may be reposed in him by any future decree or order in the premises He shall then proceed to make public sale of said real estate having given at least three weeks notice by advertisement inserted in one or more newspapers published in Frederick County of the time place manner and terms of sale which terms shall be one half of the purchase money to be paid in hand on the day of sale or ratification thereof at the election of the purchaser the residue
