 Frederick County Maryland Joseph Bryan and Sarah Person his
 wife of the City of Baltimore Robt. S. Harper and Hamet Ann
 Harper his wife of the State of Pennsylvania and William S. Shipman
 respectfully sheweth that a certain Wm. Fisher late of the City of
 Washington by his last will dated on the 25th day of May 1846
 and now recorded in Liber G S N^o 1 folio 327 &c one of the Record
 books of Wells for Frederick County devised to Elizabeth Fisher his
 mother during her life certain Real estate Situate in Frederick
 Town and after her death directed the same to be sold by his
 Executors George L. Fisher and Hamet Fisher or the survivor of them
 and devised the proceeds of sale to his Sisters Moranda Shipman
 Margaret Gombel Ann C. and my wife of William H. Collymore and
 Sarah my wife of Joseph Bryan and my case any of his said
 Sisters should die during the life time of his mother Elizabeth Fisher
 then that her portion of the estate should belong to her children all of
 which matters will more fully appear by reference to a certified copy
 of an extract of said will herewith exhibited marked Exhibit
 W^h which your Complainants pray together with all other exhibits
 hereinafter produced may be taken as part of this their bill of
 Complaint - your Complainants further state that Moranda Shipman
 one of the Sisters and legatee of said William Fisher died in the
 lifetime of said Elizabeth Fisher leaving two children Wm. Shipman
 and Hamet Ann wife of Robert S. Harper your Complainants
 further state that the said Wm. Fisher sold part of the lot described
 in said will as devised to his mother for life to John A.
 Steiner and conveyed the same to said John A. Steiner by deed
 and that said Wm. Fisher subsequently repurchased said lot from
 John A. Steiner and died seized of the same and that the
 proceedings instituted in the Circuit Court for Frederick County
