Steyer and afterwards repurchased said part and died seized of the same and that said part passed under his will to his mother for life and after her death to his sisters above named that after the death of William Fisher John A. Steyer and wife under a decree of the Circuit Court for Frederick County passed in N^o 2561 Equity conveyed said part of said lot to said Elizabeth Fisher for life and to George J. Fisher upon the trusts set forth in said decree for the use of the Complainants the sisters and the children of Moranda Shipman a deceased sister The defendant further admits that he executed the papers refusing to execute the trust of the will of William Fisher so far as the same concerns the lots in Frederick County devised to his mother Elizabeth Fisher for life and after her death the proceeds of sale to his said sisters this defendant further admits that he has refused and still does refuse to execute the trusts contained in the deed executed by John A. Steyer & wife This defendant further admits the death of Elizabeth Fisher the devisee for life as aforesaid and also the death of Samuel Fisher his Co-Executor And he now submits and begs that your Honorable Court may pass a decree discharging him from his said trust and appointing some suitable person trustee in his place

The above cause standing ready for a hearing and being submitted, the Bill answers exhibits and all other proceedings were by the Court read and considered and it appearing to the Court here that the Complainants are justified to the relief prayed for. It is this 6th day of July 1860 by Madison Nelson Circuit Judge for the third Judicial Circuit of the State of Maryland and by the authority of the Circuit Court for Frederick County as a Court of Equity ordered and decreed that William H. Colliflower of Frederick County State of Maryland be and he is hereby appointed Trustee to execute the trusts conferred upon George J. Fisher and Samuel Fisher late deceased by the will of William Fisher late deceased and conferred upon Geo J. Fisher by a decree of this Court and before passed the said George J. Fisher having refused to execute the trusts conferred upon him by said will and decrees so far as relates to the land in the proceedings in this cause mentioned, and it is further ordered and decreed that the said William H. Colliflower before proceeding to act as trustee shall file with the Clerk of this Court a bond to the State of Maryland to be executed by himself and two or more sureties to be appointed by the Court or the Clerk thereof in the penalty of eight
