Brady and Mary C. his wife of Indiana the said James Smith and Malinda L. his wife of Kentucky the said Wallace and Sarah L. his wife of Texas and the said infants Scott Hornberger and Mary Hornberger being residents of Texas and also that the said Henry Hornberger left a widow Julia Anne Hornberger who is entitled to dower in said lands and will not consent to a sale of her dower in said lands that the said lands cannot be divided amongst the several parties entitled thereto without loss or injury to the parties interested and that it will be for the benefit of all said parties that the said lands should be sold and the proceeds of sale be distributed amongst the parties entitled and that the dower of the said widow in said lands shall be laid off and assigned to her The Bill prays for a decree accordingly and also for an order of publication against said non resident Defendants Whereupon it is this 10th day of February 1860 ordered that the Complainants by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County once a week for each of four successive weeks before the 18th day of March next give notice to the said absent Defendants of the substance and object of this Bill and warn them to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor on or before the first day of June next to answer the premises and show Cause if any they have why a decree should not pass as prayed
