Lastly Do you know or have you heard of any other matter or thing that would tend to the benefit or advantage of the Complainant in this Cause if you state the same as fully as if you had been specially interrogated thereto.

At the execution of this Commission issued out of the Hon Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity to me directed and empowering me to examine evidences in a Cause pending in said Court in which Catharine M. Ogle is Complainant and Lane C. Ogle and Amos S. Ogle are defendants - said Cause being No 298 on the Equity Docket of said Court. I Myself Hobbs, the standing and duly qualified Commissioner of the said Court did at my Law Office in the City of Frederick on the 15th day of July 1861 proceed to take the following depositions to wit, Sarah C. Thomas a widow of lawful age produced on the part of the Complainant being duly sworn and examined to interrogatories filed with me by the Solicitor for the Complainant and herewith returned, deposed and says. As the first Interrogatory. I know the parties Complainant and defendants in these proceedings mentioned and have known for them from their infancy. As the 2nd Interrogatory I know John Ogle Senior by his name he died about year ago. As the 3rd Interrogatory John Ogle Senior died intestate and left the following Children viz Catharine M. Ogle Lane C. Ogle Amos S. Ogle and John C. Ogle they are all heirs. They all reside in Frederick County Maryland except John C. Ogle who resides in Missouri. As the 4th Interrogatory John Ogle Senior died seized and possessed of real estate. I have looked at the exhibits filed in this Cause marked No 1, 2, 3 & 4. The real estate of which said John Ogle Senior died seized and possessed it fully and accurately described in said exhibits to the best of my knowledge. As the 5th Interrogatory. The lands of which John Ogle Senior died seized and possessed would admit of an advantageous division among his heirs entitled thereto provided two of them would take two thirds of the Honey Farm and the other take the third which may upon it the Blacksmith Shop a stable and a log dwelling. The other lands other than the Honey farm are susceptible of an advantageous division except the tract called Good Craps and Stone which is too small. I do not think however that the lands of which said John Ogle Senior died seized and possessed are susceptible of an advantageous division among the heirs entitled thereto if said division is to be made in three equal
