

my Shelds addition to Community being by way of Mortgage to
 Samuel Landon to secure the payment of three hundred dollars
 with interest from the 19th day of May 1838 Comog and on the
 12th day of January 1841 the said John Armstrong conveyed
 the same Lot to Samuel Landon by way of Mortgage to secure
 the payment of the sum of one hundred dollars with interest
 from the 16th day of June 1840 and on the said John Armstrong
 conveyed the same Lot to Samuel Landon by way of Mortgage
 to secure the payment of one hundred dollars with interest from
 11th day of October 1841 the Bill further states that said
 John Armstrong on the sixth day of February 1843 paid fifty
 three dollars and twenty cents which is credited on the last
 mentioned note and that the first and second note with interest
 thereon and the residue of the last note with interest thereon
 are still due and unpaid and that no other payments have
 been made except the credit given. The Bill further states
 that Samuel Landon on the fourth day of February 1858 assigned
 and transferred the several notes and the mortgages given by
 said John Armstrong to secure the same to Joseph Hays the
 Complainant. The Bill further states that said John Armstrong
 died intestate in the month of June 1843 leaving a widow named
 Isabella Armstrong and that the legal estate in said Lot
 subject to said mortgage descended to the unknown heirs
 of James Armstrong Jr. who died since his father
 John Armstrong to Robert Armstrong a son who has not
 been heard from for more than twenty years or to his unknown
 heirs if any to the children of Elizabeth Hays deceased
 a daughter to Wit Deborah wife of James Thomas William
 Hays Joseph Hays the Complainant John Thomas Hays
 and Samuel B. Hays to Ann now widow of John Munson
 a daughter to Lane now widow of Samuel Berg a daughter
 and to Mary a daughter now wife of Dr James Munson

The Bill further state that Mary Munson Jane Hays
 Dr James Munson and Mary Bergon his wife James Thomas
 and Deborah Thomas his wife William Hays Samuel B.
 Hays the unknown heirs of James Armstrong deceased Robert
 Armstrong and his unknown heirs if any do not reside in
 the State of Maryland. It is therefore on this 8th day of
 June 1858 adjudged and ordered that the Complainant
 by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some
 newspaper published in Frederick County once a week for
 one month prior to the 17th day of May 1858 give notice
 to the absent and unknown defendants of the object and
 substance of this Bill and command them to appear in this
 Court in person or by Votices in or before the 21st day
 of August next to answer the premises and show Cause
 if any they have why a decree ought not to pass as prayed
