Exhibit No 2 is a Copy of the last account of the note mentioned in Ex No 1 as accounted by said Bank but that account in said account is larger than in the original notes because the interest due on the original has been added to the amount that the whole amount is still due & unpaid, and further he says not. William Mahony another witness duly sworn and says by the seventh Int. I did know William & Catharine Doole. I have looked at Exhibit No 1 being the Mortgage from Doole & wife to the Simmons which was signed sealed acknowledged and delivered in his presence by said Doole & wife & that the same subscribed to acknowledged in his signature & further he says not. No other entries being produced on said day I adjourned this Commission until the 16th day of May when at the same place after legal notice I opened it and John Doole a witness of lawful age being produced & sworn says to the first interrogatory he knows all the parties he has known them for years to the 2^d Int. he knows Mr Doole he died last Spring in 1855. To the 3^d he left a widow name Catharine and Hanson & their dependent John who are of age William who under 21 by his mania to Stephen Blue Lucretia married George N. Hager all of whom reside in Frederick County. To the 4th Int he died intestate John A. Simmons administered. To the 5th Int he died seized & seized of the tract mentioned and described in Exhibit No 1. To the 6th. If the amount due on Exhibit No 1 is true then the personal property is not sufficient. To the 7th & 8th Int he says nothing there being no other entries I closed said Commission & herewith return it this 10th day of May 1856. I also return Exhibits No 1, 2, & 3 the exemplification of the letters of Mrs A. Simmons & the interrogatories as part of the Commission.
